Re: Final modifications to the preliminary PM_{2.5} designation boundary recommendations for the State of West Virginia

Dear Mr. Weish:

In a letter to Governor Wise dated June 29, 2004, you advised that EPA intended to modify the State's designation recommendations by adding four counties to the potential PM_{2.5} nonattainment areas (Harrison, Mason, Monongalia and Pleasants). In doing so, EPA made a radical departure from the approach used in the recent 8-hour ozone designations. We continue to believe that this unilateral action is unnecessary and ill-advised. We expressed this concern in a letter to you dated August 31, 2004. Further we recommended that, should EPA pursue this course to which we are strongly opposed, only portions of the additional counties be included in the respective nonattainment areas. We then proposed alternative boundaries that included the emission sources which EPA alleges as contributing to nonattainment in nearby areas. EPA Region III senior staff advised the Division of Air Quality that these recommendations apparently did not meet the tenuous, elusive and continually shifting criteria from EPA headquarters. Our staff worked closely with the regional staff to redefine the boundaries into a more acceptable form. We are herein presenting these to EPA as our final State proposal (Attachment).

Nevertheless, we again remind EPA that large emitters which are adjacent to, or near, the primary PM_{2.5} nonattainment area would be assessed as to their impact in any nonattainment evaluation such as modeling, attainment demonstrations or control strategy development. That analysis would be regional in scope and include the large nearby emitters which would eliminate the need to expand the boundaries to include an adjacent county, or parts thereof, in the initial non-attainment area. The WVDEP possesses the authority to regulate any stationary source within the State that may require emissions control to achieve and maintain the National Ambient Air Quality Standards, regardless of whether the source is located in a nonattainment

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area. The WVDEP would exercise this authority as needed to achieve attainment in a timely manner. For these reasons and many we have voiced before, we urge once more that EPA consider removing the additional counties entirely.




Figure 1 Nonattainment portions of Mason County and nearby areas outlined in dark blue




Figure 2 Nonattainment portions of Mason County and nearby areas shaded in orange




Figure 3 Nonattainment portions of Harrison, Marion & Monongalia Counties outlined in blue




Figure 4 Nonattainment portions of Harrison, Marion and Mongalia Counties shaded orange




Figure 5 Wood County and nonattainment portions of Pleasants County outlined in blue




Figure 6 Wood County and Nonattainment portions of Pleasants County shaded orange
