Cover thoroughly the upper and lower leaf surfaces and stems with a light film of dust or spray. Applications should be in the late afternoon while foliage is wet.

AS A SPRAY: Mix 8 tablespoons to 1 gallon of water.

Your Application Dated November 9, 1983

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. A Statement of Practical Treatment must be added to the labeling. We suggest the following statement; however, if your toxicological data suggest otherwise, please submit a draft Statement of Practical Treatment for prior approval:

If swallowed - Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Drink one or two glasses of water and induce vomiting by touching the back of throat with a finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing person.

If inhaled - Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated.

If on skin - Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected areas with soap and water.

If in eyes - Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician if irritation persists.

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2. In the front panel precautionary text make the following revisions:

- a. Add "and before eating or smoking" to "Wash thoroughly after handling."
- b. Add the following to the last sentence in this section after "...and a head covering."

3. Add the following to the precautionary statements

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS
