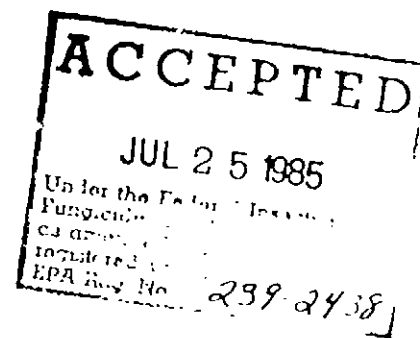

ORTHO Vegetable & Garden Fungicide mixes readily with water and may be used in an ORTHO SPRAYETTE, ORTHO Lawn & Garden Sprayer, tank type or power sprayer. Shake bottle well before using. Mix appropriate amount with water and use at once.

Apply at listed rate per crop for disease to be controlled [] in 1 gallon of water to cover an area of 200 sq. ft. (10' x 20') planted with listed crop. 1 TBS. 1 Tablespoonful, 1 tsp. 1 Teaspoonful. Repeat at 7 to 14 day intervals. Use the 7 day schedule during severe disease conditions or wet weather unless otherwise stated. Note: Avoid spraying plants during extremely hot and sunny weather. Do not apply to wilted plants.

Do not graze treated areas or feed treated plant parts to livestock.
VEGETABLES: Numbers in () indicate days required between last application and harvest.

Beans (14) (Snap Beans): Rust [1 TBS.] Begin in early bloom stage or when disease first threatens. Repeat at weekly intervals or as necessary.

Broccoli (0), Brussels Sprouts (0), Cabbage (0), Cauliflower (0): Alternaria Leafspot (Southeast only) [1 1/2 tsp.], Downy Mildew [1 1/2 tsp.] Begin after transplants are set in the field or when conditions favor disease development. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals. Ring Spot on Brussels Sprouts (California only) [2 tsp.] Begin at time of early sprout development or when conditions favor disease development. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals.

Carrots (0) Early and Late Blight [2 tsp.] Begin when disease threatens and repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals or as required to maintain control.

Celery (7): Early and Late Blight [1 1/2 tsp.], Basal Stalk Rot [1 1/2 tsp.] Begin when plants are set in the field. Repeat on a 4 to 7 day interval.

Corn (14) (Sweet): Helminthosporium Leaf Blight [2 tsp.] Begin when conditions favor disease development. Repeat at a 4 to 7 day interval or as needed. Do not apply to sweet corn for processing.

Cucumbers (0), Melons [2 tsp.], Gummy Stem Mildew [2 tsp.], Leaf Blight (California only) [2 tsp.], States) on Cucumbers [2 tsp.], Rot (Rhizoctonia) [1 TBS.] in the first true leaf stage. Repeat application if required.

Potatoes (0) Early and Late Blight [1 1/2 tsp.] Begin when disease threatens. Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals.

Tomatoes (0) Anthracnose [2 tsp.], Gray Leafspot [2 tsp.], Rhizoctonia Fruit Rot [2 tsp.], Repeat at 7 to 10 day intervals during severe conditions. Alternaria Blight [1 TBS.]--Make 3 applications 5 to 6 weeks before harvest.

ROSES, FLOWERS

Roses: Blackspot [1 tsp.] Apply to young leaves first appearance during the growing season. Spray weekly.

Chrysanthemums: Ascochyta Blight [1 tsp.] Apply at first sign of disease during growing season.

Geraniums: Botrytis Blight [1 tsp.] Apply when leaves first appear during wet weather or severe conditions.

Iris: Botrytis Blight [1 1/2 tsp.] Apply when leaves are 4 to 6 inches long.

Zinnias: Powdery Mildew [2 tsp.] Apply at the first sign of disease.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: STORAGE. Keep pesticide container closed, concentrate or dilute into final application of feed and foodstuffs. Store in a locked storage area. **DISPOSAL PRODUCT:** Dispose of by securely wrapping in paper and discard in a separate container. Rinse thoroughly.
