The following specific comments pertain to your WPS labeling submission concerning the product cited above:

The respirator requirement for "applicators and other handlers" in the Personal Protective Equipment Section maybe modified to:

For exposure outdoors: Dust/mist filtering respirator (MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-21C)

For exposure in enclosed areas: A respirator with either an organic vapor-removing cartridge with a pre-filter approved for pesticides (MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-23C) or a canister approved for pesticides (MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-14G)

Add "N-Methyl Carbamate" to your label in one of the locations shown in section E on part 2 of the Product Worksheet in Supplement Three-A to PR Notice 93-7.

Delete the crossed out statements on your proposed label. They are redundant statements or phrases.

Correct the typographical errors circled on your proposed label.

Danger:

Pesticide Storage
Do not store in or around the home.

To confine spill: If liquid, dike surrounding area or absorb with sand, cat litter or commercial clay. If dry material, cover to prevent dispersal. Place damaged package in a holding container. Identify contents.

Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.

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Alfalfa Furadan has a long residual life against alfalfa weevil larvae and can be applied earlier than other insecticides for the best control of this pest

Apply shortly after first larval feeding is observed. Make only one application per season and use the dosage rate most suitable for your needs obscrying the interval between application and harvest. Apply only to pure stands of alfalfa.

Using ground equipment, apply minimum of 10 gat, of spray/acre; by air, apply a minimum of 5 gat, of spray/acre.

Do not move bees into alfalfa fields within 7 days of application.
