SANITIZING BLEACHING DEODORIZING: Towels, pillowcases, bed sheets, cotton bathing suits-use 1 tablespoon to 1 gallon of water. Add this solution to second suds or first rinse. In addition to bleaching, germicidal and deodorant benefits are obtained.

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DISINFECTING PREMISES: Wash or clean thoroughly, then spray with a solution of 2 ozs. of bleach to each gallon water.

SWIMMING POOLS: For each 1,000 gallons of water, use 5 ozs, of bleach or a sufficient amount to establish a residual of 0.6 to 1.0 P.P.M. of available chlorine, as determined by the use of a chlorine test kit. This bleach can be poured directly into the swimming pool or fed through a mechanical chlorinator. Test water frequently and add bleach as required to maintain a residual of 0.6 to 1.0 P.P.M. of available chlorine. The amount of bleach required will depend on bathing load and other factors. If bathing load is heavy or day is hot, test in the morning and again in the evening.

WATER WELLS: Add 1 oz. of bleach per 1,000 gallons of water or sufficient amount to establish a residual of 0.2 to 0.4 P.P.M. of available chlorine as determined by the use of a chlorine test kit. Let stand 30 minutes before using.

LAUNDRY: Use 1 cup bleach per load in top-loading machines;  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup in front loading machines; or  $\frac{1}{8}$  cup per 2 gallons water. For bleaching and sanitizing white or colorfast cottons, linens, nylon, Dacron, Orlon, rayon, use bleach in washing machine or first rinse. Wash or soak for 10 minutes. Rinse well. If clothes are already in the machine dilute the bleach before using.

CLEANING KITCHEN & BATHROOM: To clean sinks, bathtubs, tile, linoleum, porcelain, enameled metal, etc., use  $\frac{1}{8}$  cup for each quart water, spread solution with cloth. Let stand 2 minutes. Rinse well.

REMOVING STAINS: For stubborn stains from fruit, grass, tea, coffee, scorch, ink, mildew, etc., soak stained area in a solution of  $\frac{1}{8}$  cup for each quart water, for 5 minutes. Rinse well. Repeat if necessary. Colored fabrics — test small piece before using. Use in glass, rubber, porcelain or enameled containers.

## "RESTAURANTS, TAVERNS, SODA FOUNTAINS, DAIRIES, ETC:

- 1. Scrape and prewash utensils and glasses whenever possible
- 2. Wash with a good detergent or compatible cleaner
- 3. Rinse with clean water.

- 4. Sanitize in a solution of 1 ounce to 2 gallons of water (200 p.p.m.). Immerse all utensils for at least two minutes or for contact time specified by governing sanitary code.
- 5. Place sanitized utensils on rack or drain board to air dry."

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
