## DIRECTIONS

Hold Press-Blast upright 2 to 4 inches from the dog or cat. Depress valve and direct spray over the animal until entire coat is damp.

For worms and ticks, an application for 30 seconds is usually sufficient. For lice, 10 seconds. In heavily coated animals, spray down the body of the hair. For ticks, the spray must hit them directly. May be repeated at weekly intervals if required. Kennel or other quarters should be thoroughly sprayed including bedding. Nervous dogs and cats soon become accustomed to the hissing noise and cool sensation of the spray.

**WARNING:** Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. Induce vomiting immediately and get medical attention. Atropine (large dose) is partly antidotal. If nervous symptoms develop, barbiturates may be indicated.
