DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not use this product in or on electrical equipment due to the possibility of shock hazard. Do not use in food/feed areas of food/feed handling establishments, restaurants, or other areas where food/feed is commercially prepared or processed. Do not use in serving areas while food is exposed or facility is in operation. Serving areas are areas where prepared foods are served such as dining rooms, but excluding areas where foods may be prepared or held.

In the home, cover all food handling surfaces and cover or remove all food and cooking utensils, or wash thoroughly after treatment. Exposed food should be covered or removed.

Non-food/feed areas of food/feed establishments are areas such as garbage rooms, lavatories, floor drains (to sewer entries and vestibules), offices, locker rooms, machine rooms, boiler rooms, garages, mop closets, and storage (after canning or bottling).

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING

Remove protective cap, hold container upright, and spray from a distance of 12 to 15 inches.

Remove birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

Houseflies, Mosquitoes, Gnats, Wasps, Hornets, Bees, Blow Flies, and Small Flying Moths: Close all doors and windows and spray room at the rate of 2 to 3 seconds per 1000 cubic feet. Direct spray to all parts of the room, especially windows and other light sources which attract these insects. Keep nozzle in constant motion. Repeat treatment as necessary.

Cockroaches, Waterbugs, Palmetto Bugs, Silverfish, Firebrats, Crickets, Scorpions, Spiders, Millipedes, Centipedes, Sowbugs, and Pillbugs: Spray into hiding places such as cracks and crevices, behind sinks, cabinets, along baseboards and floors, around drains and plumbing, hitting insects with spray whenever possible. Repeat treatment as necessary.

Ants: Spray trails, nests, and points of entry. Spray on ants where possible. Repeat as necessary.

Indian Meal Moths, Angoumois Grain Moths: Close doors and windows, direct spray into all parts of room especially around stored food product containers, pallets, and darkened areas. Spray 7 to 10 seconds for each 1000 cubic feet of space. Keep area closed for 15 minutes following treatment. Repeat application as necessary.

Exposed stages of Confused Flour Beetles, Saw-Toothed Grain Beetles, Red Flour Beetles, Rice Weevils, Granary Weevils, Grain Mites: Spray into cracks and crevices, around cartons or containers or other areas where these insects tend to congregate. Spray 30 seconds for each 100 square feet of surface. Keep area closed for 45 minutes to 1 hour after treatment. Repeat application as necessary. Infested stored food products in the home should be disposed of.

Carpet Beetles: Spray directly on beetles, floors, baseboards, shelves, and carpets. Repeat treatment as necessary.

Bedbugs: Spray mattresses, particularly around tufts and seams. Take beds apart and spray into all joints. Treat baseboards, moldings, and floors. Repeat treatment as necessary.

To control Clothes Moths: Remove any infested articles from storage, brush thoroughly, and air for several hours in sunlight, if possible. Apply spray liberally to empty chests, closets, bureaus, and other storages directing the spray into cracks, joints, and crevices. After airing, infested articles may be treated lightly, keeping nozzle at least three feet from fabric to avoid staining.

In animal quarters and milk rooms: For rapid control of House Files, Mosquitoes, Gnats, Wasps, Hornets, Bees, and Small Flying Moths, close windows and doors and spray at the rate of 2 seconds per 1000 cubic feet of space. For best results, keep area closed for 10 minutes after spraying. Do not remain in treated area and ventilate after treatment is completed.

To treat livestock: To protect beef cattle, dairy cattle, goats, sheep, hogs, and horses from attacks of Stable Flies, Horse Flies, Deer Flies, Face Flies, House Flies, Horn Flies, Mosquitoes, and Gnats: Spray about 3 seconds on each side being careful to spray back, withers, and forelegs thoroughly. To protect from face flies, spray the face and head, but do not spray into eyes. Repeat treatment when flies are troublesome.

For Swine: Do not ship animals for slaughter within 5 days of last treatment.

To control **Blood Sucking Lice:** Apply to the infested areas of the animal, using a stiff brush to get the spray to the base of the hair. Repeat every 3 weeks if required.

To control **Poultry Lice**, spray roosts, walls, and nests or cages thoroughly. This should be followed by spraying over the birds with a fine mist.

For control of Bedbugs and Mites in poultry houses, spray crevices of roost poles, cracks in walls, and cracks in nests where the bedbugs and mites hide.

Fleas and Ticks: (Adults and Larvae): Remove and thoroughly clean or destroy pet bedding. Spray pet sleeping quarters, bed, entire floor and floor covering with special attention to cracks and crevices around baseboards, and window and door frames. Infested upholstered furniture may also be treated with the product. A test application should be made to upholstery or drapery fabrics in an inconspicuous place before use.

To control Fleas, Ticks, and Lice on Dogs. Starting at the tail, stroke against the lay of the hair, spraying the parted fur in short bursts, directly behind the hand to insure penetrating the coat. Dampen the fur up to the head. Repeat application weekly if necessary to control infestation. NOTE: Not recommended for use on puppies less than four weeks old. Do not use this product of similar products on old, sick, or debilitated animals.

For the control of Garden Insects: For use on roses, dahlias, asters, and other ornamentals to kill Japanese Beetles hit by spray, as well as Whiteflies, Aphids, e-posed Thrips, Spiders, Red Mites, and Leafminers.



May be used on plants, as well as a multi-purpose spray in small gardens for spot treatments of incipient insect infestations to prevent spreading in large garden areas.

May also be used on other plants such as African violets, asters, azaleas, begonias, camellias, carnations, chrysanthemums, dahlias, delphiniums, dogwood, English ivy, euonymus, fuschia, geraniums, crassula, grape vine, Kentia palm, laurel, marigolds, rhododendrons, roses, rubber plants, snapdragons, stocks, wandering Jews, and zinnias.

Effective when used as directed against Whiteflies, Aphids, Spider and Red Mites, exposed Thrips, Lace Bugs, Japanese Beetles, Pavement Ants, Clover Mites and Army Worms.

When spraying plants, do not operate closer than 18 inches. Use sweeping motion. Spray in one second bursts. Be cautious about wetting tender foliage, young plants and new growth. Do not spray plants when temperatures exceed 90°F. Contact insects directly whenever possible. Repeat as infestations occur.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Store in a cool, dry area. Do not transport or store below 32°F.

Wrap container in several layers of newspaper and dispose of in trash. Do not incinerate or puncture.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS & DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION

Avoid inhalation of spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling and before smoking or eating. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs.
