The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under section 3(c)(7)(A) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you:

1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.

2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

- a. On the front label, following the word CAUTION it should read, "Statement of Practical Treatment."
- b. Under the heading, Important Precautions, the word "conjunction" is incorrectly spelled.
 - c. Under the Precautionary Statements heading the Mining and Safety Administration should be "Mine, Safety and Health Administration."
 - d. Under "Storage and Disposal" the word disposal should be preceded with container, i.e., "Container Disposal." Also add the following "Pesticide Disposal" statement: "Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility." Refer to PR Notice 83-3 for more information on Storage and Disposal label statements.

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We note your instructions to induce vomiting for the If Swallowed Statement of Practical Treatment. We question this instruction based upon the high percentage of petroleum hydrocarbons and the potential aspiration hazard. We normally recommend the following statements, following the first sentence in the If Swallowed statement: "Gastric lavage is indicated if material was taken internally. Do not induce vomiting unless other treatment is not available. Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia. If it is necessary to induce vomiting, give victim . . . etc."

3. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

It these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.




