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Subject: Amendment- Revise per Diazinon Registration Standard Black Leaf 5% Diazinon Dust EPA Registration No. 5887-104 Your submission dated December 13, 1994

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA section 3(c)(7)(a), is acceptable provided that you:

- Submit and/or cite all data or other materials required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) or FIFRA section 4 when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
- 2) Make the following revisions before your release the product for shipment under the amended labeling:
 - a) Revise the front panel site use limitation to read: For outdoor use on home lawns and home ornamental plantings only
 - b) Delete "cutworms" from the front panel insect claims, since this pest is not included in the retained use patterns.
 - c) Revise the text of the HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS sections to read as follows:

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed, inhaled, or absorbed through skin. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling and before eating or smoking. May cause contact sensitization following repeated contact with skin in susceptible individuals. Avoid

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repeated contact with skin. If sensitization reactions result, consult a physician. Avoid contamination of food or feed. Food utensils such as tablespoors must not be used for food purposes after use in measuring pesticides. Do not contaminate ornamental fish ponds. Do not allow children or pets on treated areas until dust has been watered into the soil and the grass or soil has dried.

d) In the STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT, revise the last sentence of the **If swallowed** advice to read as follows:

If person is unconscious or convulsing, do not give anything by mouth and do not induce vomiting.

e) In the If on skin advice, revise "and wash" to "and promptly wash"

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f) Revise the first two sentences of the Environmental Hazards to read as follows:

This pesticide is highly toxic to birds, fish, and other wildlife. Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed.

- g) In the fifth sentence of the Environmental Hazards, you may omit "and waterfowl". Revise the sixth sentence to read "Avoid overlapping of treated areas.". In the seventh sentence revise "0.25 inch" to "1/4 inch". Revise the tenth sentence to read in its entirety "Do not apply directly to water.".
- h) In the list of pests for Ornamentals, revise "Two-spotted Mites" to "Two-spotted Spider Mites".
- i) In the pest listing for Lawns, revise "Ticks" to "Brown Dog Ticks". Also, in the **Application Instructions** for this pest include "For Brown Dog Ticks, treat grass and under shrubbery, particularly near the house. Do not apply this product to animals."
- j) Based on Ciba-Geigy's wildlife data, the maximum rate of application for a 5% diazinon product to lawns for control of any pest is 4 oz. per 125 sq. ft. Please lower the application rate for control of millipedes in lawns to 4 oz. per 125 sq. ft.
- A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

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3) Submit three (3) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. Please be aware of the released for shipment date for products subject to the Diazinon Registration Standard, as amended.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

The Confidential Statement of Formula dated December 13, 1994 is acceptable and has been added to this product's EPA registration file as the current basic formula of record.
