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PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARD TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION: Keep away from humans, domestic animals and pets. If swallowed, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN — If ingested, administer Vitamin K₁, intramuscularly or orally, as indicated in bishydroxycoumarin overdoses. Repeat as necessary based on monitoring or prothrombin times.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL


DO NOT CONTAMINATE WATER, FOOD, OR FEED BY STORAGE OR DISPOSAL.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label for precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children to rodenticides. To help to prevent exposure:

1. Store product not in use in a cool, dry place.
2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children and nontarget wildlife, or stations must be resistant to children six years of age, and must prevent children from reaching into bait containers. Bait can be shaken from stations when otherwise immobilized. Eve open to hoofed livestock, ruminants, or in areas prone to flooding.
3. Dispose of product containers as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS — For control of rats around homes, industrial buildings, or other structures, place bait in areas where there are no surfaces that come in direct contact with food.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS — Likely find and consume the bait in openings, in or beside burrows, under floors and walls, or in locations where mice are likely to enter. Protect bait from rain or snow.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS

RATS: Apply 4 to 16 oz. of bait per acre. Supply of fresh bait for repeat treatments.

MICE: Apply 1/4 to 1 lb. per acre at intervals. Target greater than 90% of very high mouse activity areas. Replace bait for at least 15 days.

RATS: Replace concentrated baits every 10 days. **MICE:** Replace concentrated baits every 14 days. Limit number of bait stations if reinfestation continues. If source of infestation is not eliminated, reapply as needed.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use-precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.
2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hoofed livestock, raccoons, bears, other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.
3. Dispose of product container, and unused, spent, and contaminated bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS - For control of Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice in and around homes, industrial buildings, and similar man-made structures. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food. Do not broadcast bait.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS - Determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by drain openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS

BATS: Apply 4 to 16 oz. of bait per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.

MICE: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 oz. (1-2 level tablespoons) of bait at 8- to 11-foot intervals. Larger placements (up to 2 oz.) may be needed at points of very high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days.

PAWS/
MOUSE Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and leftover bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, maintain permanent bait stations or repelants as needed.
