Dear Ms. LaRocco;

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable subject to the comments listed below.

1. Per the DEET RED issued by the Agency August 1998<sup>1</sup>, the additional statements are required to be added to the directions for use. Therefore, revise the following paragraph with the appropriate text by removing text that is struck, and inserting new text identified with *Italics*:

"It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

~~READ ALL DIRECTIONS BEFORE USING THIS PRODUCT~~

***READ AND FOLLOW ALL DIRECTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS ON THIS PRODUCT LABEL***

Remove protective cap. Hold unit 6 to 8 inches from skin or clothing while spraying, keeping nozzle pointed away from face. Slightly moisten skin or clothing with a slow sweeping motion. *Frequent reapplication and saturation is unnecessary.* ~~Apply on face by first spraying small amount in palm of hand and spreading on face and neck.~~ *If used on the face, spray on hands first and then apply sparingly and avoid eyes. Do not spray directly onto face.*

*Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth. Apply sparingly around ears. Do not apply to children's hands. Do not apply to excessively sunburned skin or irritated skin.<sup>2</sup> Do not allow children to handle this product. When using on children, apply to your own hands and then put it on*

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*the child. Avoid over-application of this product. Wash treated clothing before wearing it again. Use of this product may cause skin reactions in rare cases. If you suspect a reaction to this product, discontinue use, wash treated skin, and call your local poison control center. If you go to a doctor, take this product with you. Do not spray in enclosed areas.*

~~Do not apply to eyes and mouth and do not apply to the hands of young children. Do not spray directly on face.~~ Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin and/or clothing. Do not use under clothing. ~~Avoid over-exposure.~~ After returning indoors, wash treated skin with soap and water.

~~Wash treated clothing.~~ Avoid contact with plastics, such as eyeglass frames, and such fabric as acetate rayon. *To repel* ~~For~~ ticks, chiggers and fleas, spray pant cuffs, socks, and around openings in outer clothing.

Will not damage nylon, cotton or wool. May damage some synthetic fabrics, plastic watch crystals, leather, painted and varnished surfaces.”

- 2. Revise the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals verbiage as follows:

~~“Instruct older children in the proper use of this product.~~

FOR EXTERNAL USE ONLY. ~~Do not spray in enclosed area.~~ <sup>3</sup> ~~Causes eye irritation.~~ ~~Do not get in eyes or mouth.~~ Harmful if swallowed *or inhaled*. Avoid breathing spray mist. *Causes moderate eye irritation.* Avoid contact with lips and eyes. *Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, or using tobacco.* ~~Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin.~~ <sup>2</sup> Do not expose treated skin or clothing to fire, sparks or flame until liquid has evaporated. ~~Do not let children rub their eyes if hands have been treated.~~ “

- 3. Within the First Aid Section, the row and associated text may be removed:

<b>If On Skin or Clothing:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Take off contaminated clothing.</li> <li>• Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes.</li> <li>• Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.</li> </ul>

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4. To be eligible for reregistration, aerosol and pump spray formulations must be packaged in containers utilizing a concave trigger to help aim product or other comparable mechanism that will ensure that the product will not be inadvertently sprayed in the eyes.
5. Current labels on DEET repellent products tend to dissolve from contact with the repellent (usually liquids). All reregistered DEET product labels must use materials that remain permanent and readable for the reasonable life of the product.
6. It is suggested that the entire Storage and Disposal section be enclosed within a box.
