GENERAL CLASSIFICATION

DIRECTIONS FOR SWIMMING POOL CHLORINATION

For a new swimming pool, start at 2.5 oz. per 1000 gallons of water. Increase by 1/2 oz. per 1000 gallons of water every 2 weeks until a chlorine residual of 2.00 mg/l is attained.

DIRECTIONS FOR PISCINE MAINTENANCE

A) ADDITIONAL CHLORINE: Add 1/2 oz. per 1000 gallons of chlorine to maintain a chlorine residual of 1.00 mg/l. (approximately 6000 gal. is treated with approximately 1/2 oz. chlorine per 1000 gallons of water. Frequency of addition depends on temperature and number of swimmers. Increase chlorine residual in increments of 1/2 oz. per 1000 gallons of water.)

NOTE: Chlorine residuals will vary, depending upon the increase in sale as chlorine is added to the water. Chlorine chlorine.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL: Store away from direct sunlight in a shaded, cool area with little ventilation. Water must be fully chlorinated before mixing with water and being released into the environment. Do not mix with acids, detergents or other chemicals which will release hazardous gases irritating to eyes, lungs and mucous membranes.
