The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with comments.

## **Proposed Amendment:**

revise labeling per EPA letter dated 9/03/03

## Major Comments:

- 1. Under Quaternary Disinfectant add "and sanitizing Egg Shells" after Hospitals and Nursing Homes.
- 2. Under "Direction For Use" on side/back add the word "hard " non-porous surfaces. Also list these surfaces.
- a. add this "and sanitizing Egg Shells" after Hospitals and Nursing Homes.
- b. delete "all surfaces" or specific the surfaces for sanitizing .
- c. add the word "followed" by a preflush, or pre-scrape and when necessary.....
- 3. Under "Direction For Use on Side/Back Panel add "non porous" hard surfaces were describing floors, walls ....
- a. The direction that read "Thoroughly clean floors, walls, ... remove these directions they were not on the last stamped label and you have not provided data to support these claims.

This product is not to be used as a terminal sterilant/high level disinfectant on any surface or instrument that (1) is introduced directly into the human body, either into or in contact with the bloodstream or normally sterile areas of the body, or (2) contacts intact mucous membranes but which does not ordinarily penetrate the blood barrier or otherwise enter normally sterile areas of the body. This product may be used to pre-clean or decontaminate critical or semi critical medical devices prior to sterilization or high level disinfection.

Thoroughly clean equipment by prescraping, presoaking or preflushing all equipment, walls and floor. Wash all surfaces thoroughly with a good detergent or compatible cleaner. Sanitize with 1/2 ounce of Quaternary Disinfectant per 4-1/2 gallons of water (provides 200 ppm of quaternary). Apply with cloth, soak or spray with automatic proportioning equipment. Make sure all surfaces have been thoroughly wetted. Treated surfaces must remain wet for at least one minute. No rinse is required after sanitizing at this concentration. Fresh solution should be prepared daily or when use solution becomes visibly dirty. For mechanical application use, solution may not be reused for sanitizing applications. . .

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### DIRECTIONS FOR USE (CONTINUED)

First wash dishes, glassware and silverware in a good detergent or compatible cleaner. Rinse thoroughly. Immerse in a solution of 1/2 ounce of Quaternary Disinfectant per 4-1/2 gallon of water (provides 200ppm of quaternary). No potable water rinse is required at this dilution.

Thoroughly clean floors, walls, and other hard surfaces by prescraping or preflushing with good detergent or compatible cleaner. Rinse. Disinfect with 1-1/2 ounces of **Quaternary Disinfectant** per 5 gallons of water (provides 550 ppm of quaternary). Apply with a clean mop or cloth so as to wet surfaces thoroughly. Treated surfaces must remain wet for 10 minutes. Prepare a fresh solution daily or when use solution becomes visibly dirty.

### Sanitizing Shell Eggs Intended for Food:

To sanitize previously cleaned food-grade shell eggs in shell egg and egg-processing plants, spray with, or immerse, in a solution of 1/2 ounce of Quaternary Disinfectant in 4-1/2 gallons of warm water (provides 200 ppm quaternary). The solution should be warmer than the eggs, but not to exceed  $130^{\circ}$ F. Wet eggs thoroughly and contact time of 1 minute is required for proper sanitation. Allow to drain and air dry. Eggs sanitized with this solution shall be subject to a potable water rinse only if they are broken immediately for use in manufacturing of egg products. Eggs should be reasonably dry before casing or breaking. The solution should not be reused for sanitizing eggs.

#### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited. Do not reuse empty container.

**Pesticide Storage:** Store in original container in area inaccessible to children. Do not store at temperatures above 120°F or below 32°F.

**Pesticide Disposal:** Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticides, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional office for guidance.
