Dear Mr. Welsh:

Thank you for your letter to Governor Martin O'Malley regarding Maryland's recommendations for designating areas under the 2006 24-hour  $PM_{2.5}$  standard. The Governor received your letter and has asked me to respond on his behalf.

Although the previous three years' worth of monitoring in the Washington area showed fine particulate levels close to the standard, the most recent 2005 to 2007 results indicate clean data. The Department agrees with EPA's findings that the Maryland portion of the Washington D.C. region complies with the 24-hour PM<sub>2.5</sub> standard, and should therefore be designated accordingly.

Clean air continues to be very important to the state of Maryland and its citizens. Under the current 8-hour ozone standard, Maryland has made significant progress in reducing air pollution, and more progress is expected upon implementation of the upcoming 24-hour fine particle standard.
