Close Lunch Options (see map for locations)

1. HUD conference location has a cafeteria on the second floor.
2. Kirbies Grill and Cafe at 410 W Redwood St is just around the corner from the conference location.
3. Café on the Square at 11 South Paca Street is two blocks from the conference location.
4. Lexington Market—this historic market has operated since 1782 and has over 80 vendors offering food, groceries, seafood and more. Located at 400 W Lexington St., three blocks from the meeting location.

11, 12,13 Inner Harbor at 601, 621 East Pratt St. (Pier 4, across from the National Aquarium) has Phillips Seafood, Potbelly Sandwiches and Blu Bambu.
