Introduction

This document is designed to guide you through the process of submitting your Notice of Intent (NOI) for coverage under the 2012 Construction General Permit using the **electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI)** system in EPA's Central Data Exchange (**CDX**). Important: Two Internet browser settings are required for the eNOI submission to work properly on your supported browser: **TLS 1.0** and **native XMLHTTP support**. These steps may vary according to your browser version.



Internet Explorer (version 7 or 8 only) – Go to Tools > Internet Options > Advanced tab > Security > Enable native XMLHTTP support and TLS 1.0 (see last slide for screenshot)



Google Chrome (only need to select TLS 1.0 for this browser) – Go to Tools (picture located at upper right hand corner) > Settings > Under the Hood > Network (Change Proxy Settings) > Advanced > Security > Use TLS 1.0



Mozilla Firefox (only need to select TLS 1.0 for this browser) – Go to Tools > Options > Advanced > Encryption

2. How to Access the 2012 CGP eNOI Application


- The electronic NOI form for the 2012 CGP is accessed through a new program in CDX, the “**electronic Notice of Intent (eNOI)**” program, which you must add to your CDX account profile.

Note: the “SWENOI” program in CDX has been disabled for the CGP, and can only be used for LEW waivers and for MSGP coverage.

The access and use of CDX Registration for the electronic submittal of environmental information require the creation of a user ID and password that I must maintain and keep confidential. I will review the following steps concerning the creation and maintenance of a user ID and password.

Choosing a CDX Password

For CDX registration purposes, I agree to select a password which will not be easily guessed (e.g., my name, my children's names, birthdays, etc.). Passwords must be a minimum of 8 alpha-numeric characters (no spaces or special characters) and contain at least 1 of each of the following:

- uppercase character
- lowercase character
- number

Passwords may *not* begin with a number nor contain the word "password" nor contain your User Name.

Protecting my CDX Password

However, you must wait for the Working Copy to become active before operating according to the updated NOI.

- After creating a Working Copy, the Working Copy must be recertified by the Certifier and must be submitted to EPA in order to initiate the 14-day review period.

8. Modifying the CGP eNOI Form After Permit Coverage has been Obtained

- After submitting the Working Copy to EPA, during the 14-day review period the original NOI will have a status of “Active/Original”, and the “Working Copy” will have a status of “Pending Certification”
