#### **Federal Regulations**

Code of Federal Regulations (CFR)



- where final promulgated regulations are published
- published each year—includes regulations final as of July 1
- Title 40: Protection of Environment
- www.gpoaccess.gov



#### Federal Regulations (continued)

- Federal Register (FR)
  - where rules are first proposed and then promulgated
  - published daily
  - includes background information (e.g., preamble, summary of response to comments)
  - www.gpoaccess.gov



# Federal Government and State/Territory/Tribe Roles

- Before state/territorial/tribal program authorization:
  - EPA issues permits
  - EPA conducts compliance and monitoring activities
  - EPA enforces
- After state/territorial/tribal program authorization:
  - state/territory/tribe implements as above
  - EPA oversees
    - administrative, technical and legal support and training enforcement as necessary
    - grants






### Types of NPDES Permits – Individual

- Individual Permit


  - appropriate where facility-specific permit conditions (e.g., effluent limitations, management practices, monitoring and reporting) are needed




#### **Types of NPDES Permits - General**

- General Permit (40 CFR 122.28)
  - 1 permit issued many notices of intent submitted
  - Appropriate where
    - multiple, similar sources (e.g., same category or similar process) within the same geographic area require permit coverage
    - sources have similar discharges and would require the same or similar permit conditions
  - Permit must identify:
    - area of coverage
    - sources covered
    - application process (Notice of Intent)







# Types of NPDES Dischargers — POTW and Non-POTW

- EPA groups dischargers into publiclyowned treatment works (POTW) and non-POTW permits
- POTWs are treatment works owned by a state or municipality
  - include devices and systems used in the storage, treatment, recycling, and reclamation of municipal sewage or industrial wastes of a liquid nature
- Non-POTWs include all other facilities and are often called "non-municipals" or "industrials"



#### Types of NPDES Permits— Major and Minor

#### Major POTWs

- Design flow of 1 million gallons per day (MGD) or greater or
- Other POTWs designated as a major

#### Major Non-POTWs

- Score 80 or more points on the "NPDES Permit Rating Worksheet"
- Other non-POTWs designated as a major
- Everything else is a minor

	Type of Facility	Approximate Number of Facilities
Major	Individual Permits POTWs Non-POTWs or Non-municipals	6,700 (4,200) (2,500)
Minor	Individual Permits POTWs Non-POTWs or Non-municipals	39,000 (10,000) (29,000)
Minor	<ul><li>Covered by General Permits</li><li>Non-stormwater</li><li>POTWs and Industrial Facilities</li></ul>	71,000

#### **NPDES Stormwater Program**

- Phase I November 16, 1990
   (effective December 17, 1990)
   medium and large municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s)
  - industrial activity, including large construction activity (>5 acres)
- Phase II December 8, 1999 (effective February 7, 2000)
  - small MS4s
  - small construction activity(≥1 acre and <5 acres)</li>
  - no exposure (industrial activity)

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#### Current and Projected NPDES Universe— Stormwater (Estimates)

Type of Facility	Approximate Number of Facilities
Stormwater: Phase I MS4s	1,000
Stormwater: Phase II MS4s	6,000
Stormwater: Phase I Industrial	96,500
Stormwater: Phase II Industrial	36,000
Stormwater: Phase I Construction	158,500 per year
Stormwater: Phase II Construction	91,500 per year
