REEVALUATION OF 24-HOUR REENTRY INTERVAL

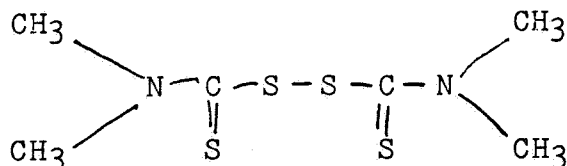

7. CONCLUSIONS:

A 24-hour reentry interval for turf use of THIRAM on golf courses would necessitate a shut-down of the golf course, and the registrant's concern is appropriate.

8. RECOMMENDATIONS:

Accept the modification of the reentry statement as proposed by NOR-AM.

9. BACKGROUND:

The 24-hour reentry statement was required by the THIRAM Registration Standard. The registrant agrees that it is appropriate for trees and row crops, but notes that they have received numerous protests from the market place since this restriction makes THIRAM unusable for golf courses. They have suggested the replacement statement:

Do not reenter treated areas within 24 hours following application unless protective clothing is worn or, on golf course turf, until the deposit is thoroughly dry.
