I. INTRODUCTION

ICI Americas Inc. representative, Robert E. Ridsdale, in a letter dated 30 Apr. 1984 to Timothy Gardner responded to an unfavorable Toxicology Branch Risk Assessment (27 March 1984) for CYMBUSH® 3E Insecticide by submitting a modified label which includes mandatory protective clothing for the mixer/loader.

II. CONCLUSIONS

The mixer/loader exposures have been lowered to 10% of what they were in my March 2, 1984 memorandum to John Doherty (see Table 1). These reduced estimates had been forwarded months ago to Tox. Branch (Hitch, 17 May 1984 memorandum to Ed Budd). Table 1 is excerpted from the May 17, 1984 memorandum and the current action merely logs out the registration papers thru proper channels.
