ICI Specialty Chemicals Division has responded to earlier data requirements imposed by the Branch on Vantocil 1B, a microbicide used in oil drilling operations. Originally the Branch had reviewed 1989 labeling which did not preclude use in marine or estuarine located oil field operations for Vantocil 1B, despite such restrictions on Vantocil A, an earlier product. Due to this fact, it was necessary to require estuarine organism toxicity testing requirement. The company has since revised the label (received 8/20/90) to read "Do not apply in, over, or near marine and/or estuarine oil fields." This restriction is sufficient to negate the need for 72-3 testing requirements and the waiver is therefore granted for these testing requirements.

Chronic testing requirements were originally requested based on persistence characteristics of Vantocil B and acute toxicity values below 1.0 ppm reported for freshwater organisms. At this time the requirement for chronic toxicity testing of industrial microbiocides with fish and invertebrate species is being deferred to the Office of Water under their NPDES permitting regulations. Therefore, the waiver request regarding 72-4 testing requirements is justified.
