This meeting will give ICI an opportunity to reply to our
October 27, 1983, letter (copy attached), which raised several
questions about the fish and wildlife hazards of their Volid
Rodenticide Pellets (EPA File Symbol 10182-LI). The meeting
will also give the company an opportunity to explain why
their third generation anticoagulant, Brodifacoum, should be
registered in orchards to control meadow and pine mice.

At the present time, Brodifacoum is basically only registered
for control of domestic rats and mice (Norway rat, roof rat,
and house mouse) in and around buildings (see attached label).

In preparation for this meeting, the Ecological Effects
Branch has requested that the studies on the attached sheet
be reviewed by the indicated Branch (Toxicology or Residue
Chemistry).

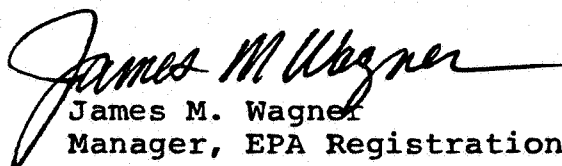

Your Letters of April 29 and May 18, 1983

We have completed our risk assessment of the proposed use of brodifacoum (BFC) in orchards and have concluded that the proposed use could produce serious hazards and significant population reductions to non-target organisms in and, around orchards. Such hazards include a potential 60% to 80% reduction of screech owl populations and on quantified avian and mammalian mortality. BFC is highly toxic, both primarily and secondarily, and very persistent in the environment. A complete copy of our review has been previously submitted to your company. If you wish to pursue this or other field uses of BFC, we would suggest that you schedule a conference with us to discuss the problems associated with these uses.

If you elect to have a meeting, please submit the following information prior to the meeting:

- 1) Readable and complete copy of Reference 11-T (Hegdall, et al, 1983), Acc. No. 250077.
- 2) Readable and complete copy of Reference 14-T (North, 1983), Acc. No. 250077.
- 3) Final reports for any preliminary reports submitted in Acc. No. 250077.
- 4) List of specific questions that you wish to discuss.
- 5) Complete text of computer program used for your population model.
- 6) Complete details on the Gram 2/1 HDLC Technique, including modifications alluded to in ABC, Inc. Report 101. Copy of all available recovery data for Gram 2/1 Technique.

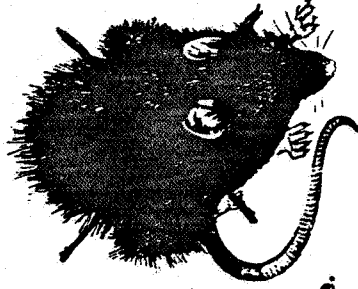

Norway and Roof Rats:

Apply 4 to 16 ounces of bait (usually at intervals of 15 to 30 feet) per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for 10 days or until signs of rat activity cease.

House Mice:

Apply ¼ to ½ ounce of bait at intervals of 8 to 12 feet per placement. Larger placements (up to 2 ounces) may be needed at points of very high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for 15 days or until signs of mouse activity cease.

Rats & Mice:

Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and unconsumed bait according to "Disposal" paragraph. To prevent reinfestation, eliminate food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations or replenish bait as needed.

In addition, final (not preliminary) reports for all references in Acc. #250077.

4. The following studies are to be deferred to the respective Branches for review. The copies of their reports for these studies should be in EEB's possession at least four weeks before the meeting.

that ICI and/or its contractors' subsidiaries have, should be made available to the Residue Chemistry Branch.

5. The registrant should submit in writing specific questions and/or points that they wish to discuss at least six weeks prior to the meeting.
6. The registrant should submit the complete text of the computer program they used for their population model. EEB requires this program in order to utilize the data as we see it in an identical computer print-out for comparison to Dr. North's printouts.
