## DIRECTIONS

GLADIOLUS, LILY, NARCISSUS, TULIP, IRIS AND HYACINTH: (Exposed Thrips) Apply to give complete coverage when plants are about 6 inches high. Repeat at 7-10 day intervals.

**BULB STORAGE:** Remove bulbs after ripening but before skins dry and break. Cut off leaves and stem after bulbs have dried. Remove soil and old skin. Put bulbs in a plastic or paper bag with Bulb Dust and shake gently to coat bulbs thoroughly; or dust bulbs directly, covering thoroughly, in open container. Store bulbs on screening and observe temperature, humidity recommendations.

**PLANTING:** Bulbs treated for storage, if still coated can be planted directly. Otherwise treat as for storage and plant.

**SLURRY COATING:** Mix 8 oz. in 1/2 gallon of water, dip bulbs in slurry on plastic or metal screening or netting, roll with stick to cover each completely, remove and dry for storage or may be planted directly.
