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ORCHARDS AND GROVES: For control of meadow mice and pine mice in orchards and groves. Apply bait after harvest while plants are in a non-bearing phase.

Hand Baiting: Near the base of each infested tree, place one teaspoon of bait at 2-4 locations, either on surface trails or at the mouth of holes leading to underground burrow systems.

Broadcast Baiting: Broadcast evenly under infested trees by cyclone seeder, or wear rubber gloves and brodcast by hand. Concentrate in areas with the heaviest vegetation cover. Do not broadcast on bare ground or growing crops. Apply at the rate of 6-10 lbs./acre.

Aerial Application: Apply at the rate of 6-10 lbs./acre. Do n.t apply on bare ground or growing crops.

ORNAMENTAL AND NURSERY STOCK (Such as forest nurseries, Christmas tree nurseries, forage crops, nurseries and landscape plantings): Por control of meadow mice and pine mice in ornamental and non-bearing nursery stock. Do not apply on roads, over water, or where plants are grown for food or feed.

Hand Baiting: Near the base of infested stock, place one teaspoon of bait at 2-4 locations, either on surface trails or at the mouth of holes leading to underground burrow systems. Do not allow baits to be exposed on ground. Do not disturb the runway system. Apply at the rate of 2-3 lbs./acre.

Broadcast Baiting: Broadcast evenly under infested nursery stock or non-bearing fruit trees by cyclone seeder, or wear rubber gloves and broadcast by hand. Concentrate in areas with the heaviest vegetation cover. Do not broadcast on bare ground. Apply at the rate of 6-10 lbs./acre.

HAND BAITING IN NON-CROP AREAS (Such as lawns, ornamentals, gotfcourses, parks and nurseries): USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of memdow and pine mice (voles, Microtus, spp.), Thirteen-lined ground squirrels (Spermophilus tridecemlineatus).

Columbian ground squirt., rels (Spermophilus columbians) and Richardson's ground squirrels. (Spermophilus richardsonii). This product must not be applied on roads, over water or where plants are grown for food or feed.

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Prebaiting with 6 pounds of untreated oat groats per acre, 2-3 days prior to applying toxic bait has been shown to provide more consistent acceptance by target species when baiting with acute toxicants.

HAND BAITING: Place 4 grams (one teaspoon) of bait around each active burrow or runway, allow bait to fall through grass to ground surface but do not apply to bare ground. Do not place in heaps or piles.

BUILDINGS (homes, industrial agricultural and commercial buildings, and similar structures): For control of Norway rats, roof rats and house mice. Pait must be placed in locations not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals and wildlife, or in tamperproof bait boxes. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food.


General Information: Remove as much food as possible and determine dry, acid-free areas where rodents are likely to find and consume the bait (usually along walls, gnawed openings, for beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, and wherever evidence of rodents has been observed). Provide a continuous supply of fresh bait until all signs of feeding have stopped. Do not treat the same area with bait at less than 30 day intervals. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and excess bait properly.

Norway Rats and Roof Rats: Apply 1 or 2 teaspoons of bait per placement. Outdoors - place bait in active rat burrows or tamper-proof boxes.

House Mice: Apply 1 teaspoon of bait per placement at 8-12 ft. Intervals. Outdoor - protect bait from rain or snow.
