Dear Mr. McEntee:

The amended label referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide. Fungicide and Rodenticide Act as amended is acceptable provided the following changes are made:

- 1. Delete the phrase "Organic Disease Protection" from the label. This is considered to be an implied safety claim and therefore is unacceptable according to 40CFR156.10(a)(5)(ix).
- 2. If the First Aid statements do not appear on the front panel of the final printed labeling, add the following referral statement to the front panel of the label: "See additional first aid statements elsewhere on label."
- 3. Add the "Net Weight" to the front panel.
- 4. In the First Aid block, delete the statement "FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY INVOLVING THIS PRODUCT CALL: CHEMTREC AT: 1-800-424-9300". Chemtrec only deals with pesticide spills, not human exposures.
- 5. Move the "Storage and Disposal" box to below the "DIRECTIONS FOR USE" header, either near the beginning or at the end of this section.

One copy of the label stamped "Accepted with comments" is enclosed for your records. This label supercedes all labels previously accepted for this product. Please submit one copy of the final printed label that incorporates the required changes before the product is released for shipment.

FIRST AID

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY INVOLVING THIS PRODUCT CALL:

IF INHALED:

Move person to fresh air.

If person is not breathing, call 911, or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably by mouth to mouth, if possible.

IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING

Take off contaminated clothing.

Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 to 20 minutes.

IF IN EYES

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

NOTICE: Do not use within 4 weeks of an oil spray or when temperature is above 90° F, as injury to foliage may occur. Sulphur may cause injury to open blooms. Do not apply to cucumbers, melons, or squash. Sulphur may cause injury to certain apple and bean varieties, pears, and concord and other labrusca type grapes.

AS A DUST: Dust lightly to both upper and undersides of leaves avoiding dusting of open blooms. Do not apply heavily as burning may occur.

AS A SPRAY: Mix 2½ level tablespoons in a small amount of water, stirring until a thin paste is formed, then add water to make 1 gallon of mixture. Stir thoroughly and agitate occasionally while spraying. Do not store diluted spray. Make new dilution for each use.

VEGETABLES - BEANS, PEAS: Powdery Mildew, Rust (on Beans). Dust or spray every 7 to 10 days during growing season. Sulphur may injure certain varieties of beans. Check plant tolerance prior to use. TOMATOES: Russet Mite. To clean up early infestations, dust or spray when fruit begins to set. Repeat treatments as necessary. Do not apply sulphur to tomatoes.

within 40 days of harvest if they are to be canned in metal containers. For Red Spiders on tomatoes, dust or spray when pests appear. Repeat as necessary.

FLOWERS AND ORNAMENTALS - ASTER, AZALEA, CALENDULA, CHRYSANTHEMUM, CREPE-MYRTLE, DOGWOOD, DAHLIA, DELPHINIUM, LIGUSTRUM, LILAC, MAPLE, PHLOX, RHODODENDRON, ROSE, SNAPDRAGON & ZINNIA: Powdery Mildew. Dust or spray at 7-10 day intervals. For Black Spot on ROSES dust or spray at 7-10 day intervals. ARBORVITAE, CARNATION, CEDARS, CHRYSANTHEMUM, CLEMATIS, HYDRANGEA, ROSE, SNAPDRAGON & SWEETPEAS: Red Spiders. Dust or spray at 5-7 day intervals.

FRUIT TREES AND GRAPES - CHERRIES, PEACHES, PLUMS, PRUNES: Brown Rot. Spray or dust just before fruit starts to ripen. APPLES, PEARS: Scab. Spray when buds begin to swell and at 10 day intervals until 2 weeks after petal fall. During wet weather, make additional treatments. Sulphur may injure certain apple varieties. Check plant tolerance prior to use. Do not apply to pears after fruit begins to turn down. GRAPES: Powdery Mildew. Dust or spray when buds begin to break and at intervals of 2 weeks for at least 4 applications (6 treatments may be necessary). Do not apply to Concord or other sulphur-sensitive grape varieties.
