

WADING AND SWIMMING POOLS: To sanitize and prevent growth of algae, add 1 tablespoon (or 1 ounce) SUNRAE for each 100 gallons of water. For 500 gallon pool, use 5 ounces. Add directly into the water. Repeat daily, or as needed, to maintain 0.6 to 1.0 p.p.m. Residual Chlorine. Use test kit. Maintain pH (acidity/alkalinity) of the water according to recommendations of local Public Health Authority.

DISINFECTANT FOR BAR AND RESTAURANT GLASSES: Wash thoroughly. Let stand several seconds in solution of two tablespoons (or 1 ounce) of SUNRAE per gallon water. Rinse in clean water. We repeat, wash first.

GARBAGE CANS: Destroys odors; swab out can with two or three gallons of water containing a cupful of SUNRAE. Rinse out with hose.

REFRIGERATOR: To sweeten, deodorize and kill mildew spores, wash with 1/2 cup SUNRAE to a gallon water. Rinse with clean water.

TILE, DRAINBOARD, PORCELAIN SURFACES: To whiten, remove fruit and coffee stains, etc., use 1/2 cup SUNRAE to a quart of water. Wash on. Rinse with water in 5 minutes. For rust stains, use lemon.

BASEMENT AND SINK DRAINS: To deodorize, flush with a cup of SUNRAE in half a gallon of water.

TOILET BOWLS: To remove stains and odors; pour 1 cup SUNRAE into bowl; swab solution over inside surfaces and under rim, flush toilet. Repeat every few days in hot weather. Mop floor around bowl with half a cup of SUNRAE in a pail of water.

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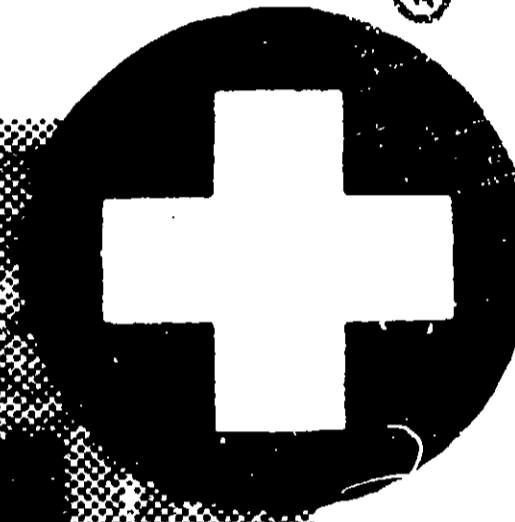

FOR BLEACHING COTTON, LINEN, NYLON, DACRON, ORLON, DYNEL, RAYON, ETC., SEE DETAIL BELOW.

DO NOT USE AT ALL ON SILK OR WOOL

TO REMOVE MILDEW, STAINS AND SCORCH. Wash out starch, then mix 2 ounces of SUNRAE to each quart of hot warm water. Add a teaspoonful of baking soda. Mix well, immerse article completely. Let stand 15 minutes or until stain is gone. Rinse and dry thoroughly.

RUST cannot be removed with bleach. It requires an acid. Try lemon, or pure vinegar, or in extreme case, oxalic acid.

THE NEW FABRICS, Nylon, Dacron, Orlon, Dynel, Rayon and mixture or blends of materials may be safely, gently and effectively bleached by carefully following this method: to each gallon water, cold or warm, add two ounces SUNRAE and a teaspoon of baking soda. Mix, and immerse fabric for 15 minutes. **Rinse Thoroughly.**

**GENERAL WASHING DIRECTIONS FOR WHITE AND
FAST COLORED COTTON, LINEN AND NYLON**

IN WASHING MACHINE: SUNRAE works equally well in standard or automatic washers and does NOT harm porcelain linings, metal parts, rubber or glass. SUNRAE works fine with the latest laundry detergents as well as with soap. Powdered bleaches are much less effective, to the point of being entirely useless in many cases.

Use 1/2 cup SUNRAE for 5-gallon or front load, top-loading washers; 1 cup for 10-gallon or top-loading washers. Never pour in onto clothes without first diluting the SUNRAE in a half-gallon of water. Start washer promptly. SUNRAE really WHITENS whites, plus sanitizing and deodorizing.

YELLOWING: Occasionally an article which appears to be white cotton turns yellow. This is the chemical effect of chlorine on a certain type of resin coating on the cloth applied at the mill where manufactured. Newer coatings now being used do not have this fault. When it does occur, the article may be whitened again by using NEW RET COLOR REMOVER according to directions. It is available at Drug Stores.

COLORED CLOTHES: After finishing white clothes, colored clothes, if fast colors, may be safely washed in the same water, as bleach action is used up by each batch of clothes.

BABY CLOTHES, DIAPERS, BEDDING: Use SUNRAE as above directions, with your regular laundry soap or detergent. No pre-soaking. Rinse thoroughly. Removes stains, deodorizes, sanitizes.

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
