) Dear Mr. Godfrey,

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable, provided that you make the changes and follow the instructions below:

1. In the first section of the "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:" for "Mice:", "8 to 12 foot intervals" to "8- to 12-foot intervals".
2. The organization of subheadings and "subsubheadings" (e.g., "Rats:", "Mice:", "Rats and Mice:") within the "DIRECTIONS FOR USE" on your proposed label is acceptable. However, when you print the labels, make sure that the subheadings "READ THIS LABEL" and "IMPORTANT" are "parallel" in placement and at least equal in prominence with "USE RESTRICTIONS", "SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS", and "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS". All of these subheadings must be subordinant to "DIRECTIONS FOR USE", which should be centered, with the subheadings remaining left-justified. When labels are printed, preserve the existing paragraph distinctions. Do not run the numbered items under "IMPORTANT" together into one paragraph.
3. Do not add any claims or directions to the final printed label that were not part of the stamped-accepted label.
4. The "APPLICATION DIRECTIONS" on the current accepted label (stamped June 27, 1990) and the proposed revised label pertain only to a rodenticide product that is packaged as a "loose-bait" within a single labeled container. The information on net contents on your current and most recently previously-filed amendment applications also pertain only to "loose-bait" packaging. The registration of this product never has covered anything but "loose-bait"

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packaging. This product may not be "subpackaged" into placepacks or any other form of "convenience packaging".

5. We note that the minimum packaging size that you have indicated for this product is 9.5 lbs. The smallest packaging size that you may adopt for this product without applying to amend the registration is 1 lb. (16 oz.). Packages smaller than 1 lb. would require adding text to the label to indicate that the contents of the product could only be expected to control a limited number of rats.
6. In the "STORAGE" subsection of the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" section add "cool," after "Store only in original container, in a" and before "dry place inaccessible to children and pets."
7. In the "PESTICIDE DISPOSAL" subsection of the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" section add "product" after "Wastes resulting from the use of this" and before "may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility."
8. In the first sentence of the "CONTAINER DISPOSAL" subsection of the "STORAGE AND DISPOSAL" section add "into application equipment." after "Completely empty container".
9. Reword the "HAZARD TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS" subsection of the "PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS" section to exactly conform to the following wording:

"CAUTION: Keep away from humans, domestic animals, and pets. Keep away from feed or foodstuffs. May be harmful or fatal if swallowed or absorbed through the skin because this material may reduce the clotting ability of blood and cause bleeding.

"This product should be handled with gloves. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Wash arms, hands, and face with soap and water after applying and before eating and smoking. If swallowed, call a physician immediately."
10. Alter the first section in the "ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS" section so that it reads:

"This product is toxic to fish and wildlife."
11. Submit one copy of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product bearing the amended labeling constitutes acceptance of these conditions. A stamped copy of the label is provided for your records.

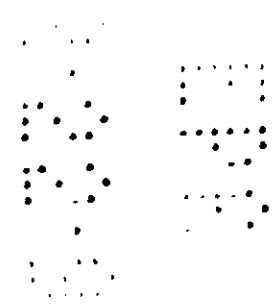

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.
2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hooved livestock, raccoons, bears, other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.
3. Dispose of product container, and unused, spoiled, and unconsumed bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS : For control of Norway rats, roof rats and house mice in and around homes, industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food. Do not broadcast bait.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rats and mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much food as possible.

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APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:


RATS: Apply 4 to 16 oz. of bait per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.

Mice: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 oz. of bait at 8 to 12 foot intervals. Larger placements (up to 2 oz.) may be needed at points of very high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days.

Rats and Mice: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and leftover bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store only in original container, in a dry place inaccessible to children and pets.
