DIRECTIONS FOR USE

To Kill Ticks and Fleas on Dogs—Thoroughly mix at the rate of ½ fluid ounce (one tablespoonful) with one gallon of water. Bathe or dip dog, making sure dog is thoroughly wet.

Repeat treatment as necessary but not more often than once a week.

Do not use dilute emulsion which has been prepared more than 30 days. Discard and prepare fresh material.

To Kill Ticks & Fleas in Yards, Kennels, Etc.—Mix at the rate of 2½ fluid ounces, (5 tablespoonful) in one gallon of water. Spray or sprinkle at the rate of one gallon per 1000 square feet of yard or kennel area. Make sure to treat possible hiding places such as cracks in cement or wood, around dog's bedding and various pieces of debris. Do not treat areas occupied by unprotected humans.

WARNING

Hazardous if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. Do not use at concentrations greater than recommended. Do not inhale spray. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. POISON ANTIDOTE

Call a physician immediately. If swallowed, give a teaspoonful of salt in a glass of warm water and repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Have victim lie down and keep quiet. If on skin, or spilled on clothing, remove contaminated clothing and immediately wash skin with soap and water. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. Note to Physician: 2-chloro-1-(2, 4-dichlorophenyl) vinyl diethyl phosphate is a cholinesterase inhibitor and treatment of severe poisoning should include the use of atropine. Give artificial respiration if breathing has stopped.

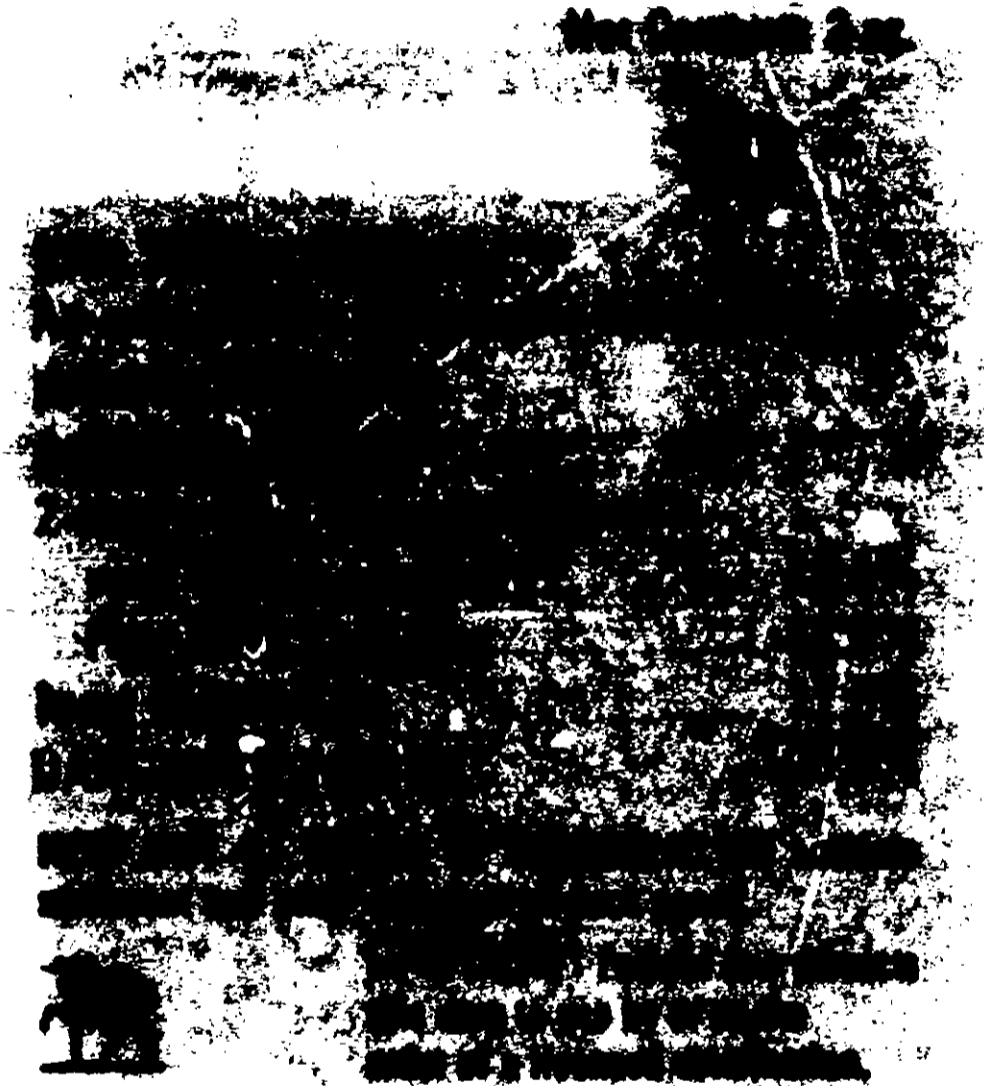

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

To Kill Ticks and Fleas on Dogs - Thoroughly mix at the rate of 1/2 fluid ounce (one tablespoonful) with one gallon of water. Bathe or dip dog, making sure dog is thoroughly wet.
