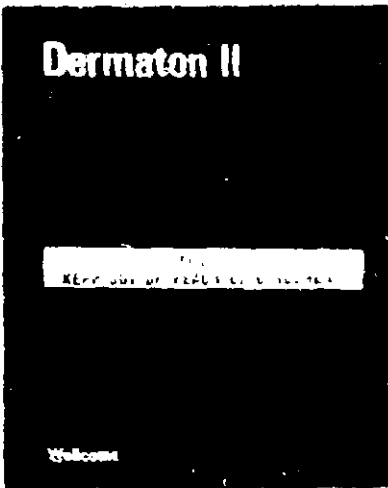

**DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

**GENERAL CLASSIFICATION**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.  
**Ticks and Fleas on Dogs**—Thoroughly mix 1 fluid ounce (2 tablespoons) with one gallon of water. Bathe or dip dog, making sure dog is thoroughly wet. Repeat treatment as necessary but not more often than once a week. Use freshly prepared material. Wear rubber gloves while preparing dip and treating dog.

**Ticks & Fleas in Yards, Kennels, Etc.**—Mix at the rate of 1/2 fluid ounce (1 tablespoon) in 1 pint of water. Spray or sprinkle at the rate of one pint per 100 square feet of yard or kennel area. Do not treat areas occupied by unprotected humans. Wear rubber gloves while preparing and using spray.

**WARNING: HAZARDS TO HUMANS.** May be fatal if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Harmful if inhaled. Avoid breathing spray mist. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing.

**HAZARDS TO DOMESTIC ANIMALS: DO NOT USE ON CATS.**

**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL**—Do not reuse container. Wrap container and put in trash collection. Do not use or store near heat or open flame.

**NOTE: CONSULT A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY. NOTE: ATROPINE IS ANTI-DOTAL.** Artificial respiration or administration of oxygen may be lifesaving. If swallowed, gastric lavage is indicated. **DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING** unless under medical supervision. Vomiting petroleum distillates can produce aspiration pneumonia. If vomiting occurs spontaneously, **DO NOT** let victim lie down. **DO NOT** allow any material to enter the airway. If on skin, or spilled on clothing, remove contaminated clothing and immediately wash skin with soap and water. In case of eye contact, immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 10 minutes. If inhaled, remove victim to fresh air. **NOTE TO PHYSICIAN:** 2-chloro-1-(2,4-dichlorophenyl) vinyl diethyl phosphate is a cholinesterase inhibitor and treatment of poisoning should include atropine.
