The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

1. The STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT given is inadequate, please revise the following statements: (Underscoring used to highlight certain revisions; please do not reproduce underscoring on the label.)

"STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed-Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately.

Drink one or two glasses of water and induce
vomiting by administering syrup of ipecac or touching
the back of throat with finger. Repeat until
vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting
or give anything by mouth to an unconscious
person.

If inhaled— Remove victim to fresh air. Apply artificial respiration if indicated."

2. The "Pesticide Disposal" section is in error in the Storage and Disposal section. It refers to container disposal. Due to the small size of the containers for the subject product (gallon is maximum) you may use the Howeowner Storage and Disposal statement. Also if you wish to use the full Storage and Disposal statement, you should have different statements for glass and plastic containers. Enclosed for your convenience are appropriate Storage and Disposal handouts. 3. A Symptoms of Poisoning section must be added to the label in close proximity to the STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT; we suggest the following:

"SYMPTOMS OF POISONING: headache, nausea, dizziness, loss of equilibrium, muscle spasms, difficulty in breathing, hyper-excitibility and convulsions."

Submit five (5) copies of your revised final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment with the amended labeling.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

If you hold a Federal registration, a supplemental registration, or a Special Local Needs registration, you may continue to produce new stocks of such products, using current labeling, until April 1, 1984. After that date, all remaining inventories of affected products will fall under the Existing Stocks provisions stated in our letter of October 28, 1983.
