The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A), is acceptable, providing that you:

1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Make the labeling changes listed below before releasing the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. On the placepack label, delete the non-household STORAGE AND DISPOSAL instructions. Household STORAGE AND DISPOSAL instructions are sufficient for the 4-oz. placepack.

Under "Disposal:", change ". . . empty container." to ". . . empty pack." [or, ". . . empty bags.", if you prefer referring to the package as a bag rather than a pack]
 - b. On the pail container label, delete the sentence "Container may be reused for non-food or feed purposes if thoroughly cleaned." from the "Container Disposal:" instructions. This sentence does not comply with the container disposal instructions specified in PR Notice 83-3.
 - c. On both the placepack and pail labels, change ". . . atleast 15 days." to ". . . at least 15 days." in the last sentence under the APPLICATION DIRECTIONS for "MICE:".

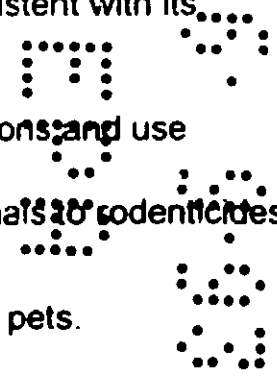
Directions for Use

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

READ THIS LABEL: Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use precautions.

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

- 1) Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.

- 2) Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and non-target wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hooved livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.
- 3) Dispose of product container, and unused, spoiled, and unconsumed bait as specified on this label.

USE RESTRICTIONS - For control of Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice in and around homes, industrial buildings, and similar man-made structures. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food. Do not broadcast bait.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS - Determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS

RATS: Apply 1 to 4 placepacks per bait placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.

MICE: Open placepack and apply 1/4 to 1/2 oz. (1-2 level tablespoons) of bait at 8 to 12 foot intervals. Larger placements (up to 2 oz.) may be needed at points of very high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days.

RATS/MICE: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and leftover bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL (8 pt)

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

Storage: Store in original container in a cool, dry location inaccessible to children and pets.

Pesticide Disposal: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

Container Disposal: Dispose of empty container in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke. Container may be reused for non-food or feed purposes if thoroughly cleaned.
