Pour 4-16 ozs. of Kill-Ko Rat Blues-D into a shallow container and place next to burrows, in runways or where rats feed, water or travel. It is desirable to place the bait along walls, in corners, and in concealed locations where rats can feed un-observed.

Check bait stations daily to assure an uninterrupted supply of bait for at least 15 days. Continue baiting until all signs of feeding have stopped.
