**PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENT
HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND
DOMESTIC ANIMALS**

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or inhaled. Will cause skin and eye irritation. Not for consumption. Avoid breathing spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wear rubber or plastic gloves and a face shield when handling the concentrate. Do not contaminate food or feed.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

Keep out of any body of water. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of waste.

Hot Sauce Animal Repellent is a water miscible, highly concentrated extract, derived from hot peppers. It is used to repel Deer, Rabbit, and Meadow and Pine Mice (*Microtus* spp.) that feed on ornamental trees and shrubs and dormant fruit and nut trees. Animals attempting to feed on treated plants will not be harmed. The warm sensation in their throats will discourage feeding where there is freedom of choice of food. Vapor Gard[®], an anti-transpirant film former, is used to prolong the life of the Hot Sauce Animal Repellent by reducing the effects of weathering factors.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal. Open dumping is prohibited.

Pesticide, spray mixture, or rinse water that cannot be used according to label instructions must be disposed of according to Federal or approved state procedures under Subtitle C of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act.

Triple rinse (or equivalent), then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration if allowed by state and local authorities.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED: Do not induce vomiting. Call a physician.
IF INHALED: Remove victim to fresh air.
IF ON SKIN: Remove contaminated clothing and wash affected area lightly with soap and water. Do not rub. Launder clothing before reusing.
IF IN EYES: Flush with plenty of water. Call a physician.
NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: If Swallowed: Lavage with large bore tube and saline solution followed by instillation of antacids and antispasmodic such as Benadryl. If aspirated into trachea, lungs or bronchial tubes, patient should be treated as an acute upper airway burn by a respiratory specialist.
If in Eyes: Topical anesthetic eye drops after flushing.

MIXING DIRECTIONS: Combine 6 to 8 ounces of Hot Sauce Animal Repellent with 1 to 2 quarts of Vapor Gard[®] in 100 gallons of water. (2 tbsp. Hot Sauce Animal Repellent with 1/2 pint of Vapor Gard[®] in 12 1/2 gallons of water.)

It is important to premix both the Hot Sauce Animal Repellent and the Vapor Gard[®] before the addition to the bulk of the water in the spray tank.

HYDRAULIC SPRAYERS: Thoroughly mix 6 to 8 fluid ounces of Hot Sauce Animal Repellent in a gallon of water. Then, in a second bucket, mix 1 to 2 quarts of Vapor Gard[®] in a gallon of water. Stir each solution to assure uniformity. Add immediately, with agitation, to the bulk of the water in the spray tank, to make 100 gallons of spray mix.

OTHER SPRAY APPLICATION EQUIPMENT: Add the premixed 6 to 8 fluid ounces of Hot Sauce Animal Repellent and 1 to 2 quarts of Vapor Gard[®] to sufficient water to cover one acre.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: For protection of Ornamental Trees and Shrubs, Fruit and Nut Trees, Fruit Bushes and Vines, and Nursery Stock, from the feeding of Deer, Rabbit and Meadow and Pine Mice (*Microtus* spp.): Use the Hot Sauce Animal Repellent and the higher Vapor Gard[®] concentration. Apply as a full coverage spray to tree trunks, branches and foliage, as needed, to repel animals. Repeat as necessary to prevent feeding. **LIMIT APPLICATION TO FRUIT BEARING PLANTS TO THE PERIOD BEFORE FRUIT**

AFTER FRUIT HAS BEEN HARVESTED

For food crops and Cotton, use one quart of Vapor Gard[®] and 6 to 8 fluid ounces of Hot Sauce Animal Repellent per acre. For plant protection, from seedling emergence until the TIME EDIBLE PORTIONS BEGIN TO FORM. Apply to Beans, Corn, Cucumbers, Melons, Peas, Brussels Sprouts, Squash, Peppers and Tomatoes. Application may be made to Cabbage, and Cauliflower BEFORE THE HEADS START TO FORM. Applications may be made to Cotton BEFORE THE BOLLS START TO FORM.

DO NOT USE TREATED FOLIAGE FOR ANIMAL BEDDING OR FEED.
