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Subject: Amendment - Voluntary changes intended to reduce risks to birds D.z.n Granular Lawn Insect Control EPA Reg. No. 100-468 Your submission dated August 19, 1992

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with a registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act is acceptable provided the following revisions are made prior top release for shipment under the amended labeling:

- 1) Under the heading "OVERALL LAWN APPLICATION", make the following revisions to the boxed text for avian hazards:
 - a) Revise the heading for the avian hazards boxed text to read "SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS TO REDUCE RISKS TO BIRDS".
 - b) Revise the first two sentences to read as follows:
 - "Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. To reduce risks to birds:".
 - c) In item "7", revise the beginning of the sentence to read "If it is necessary ...".
- 2) In the directions for control of Billbugs, etc., revise the first sentence of the Timing/Special Directions to read:

"Water grass with at least 1/4 inch of water after application, however, stop watering before puddling occurs.".

3) In the directions for control of Hyperodes weevils, revise the first sentence of the Timing/Special Directions to read:

"Water grass with at least 1/4 inch of water after application, however, stop watering before puddling occurs.".

- 4) In the Environmental Hazards, revise the second sentence to read: "Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed.".
- 5) Also in the Environmental Hazards, delete "Collect, mix into the soil, or cover granules that are spilled or are visible on soil surfaces.". This statement, while appropriate to use on bare soil, i.e., vegetable gardens pre-plant, is not appropriate for a homeowner lawn use product.
- 6) Is there a reason the Environmental Hazards text is fragmented into a number of paragraphs, rather than just being a single one, as on your other diazinon labels?

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records. Please submit five copies of the revised amended label prior to release for shipment under the amended label. The Agency understands that this labeling will be typeset for use as one of the sample labels for diazinon end-use product registrants, and that, for Ciba-Geigy, labeling for this product released for shipment after the deadline imposed by the Diazinon Registration Standard, as amended, will be this revised amended label.

Please note that the Agency's acceptance of this label at this time does <u>not</u> preclude future label revision requirements or other regulatory actions by the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency in regards to avian risk reduction.

SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID HAZARD TO BIRDS

Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks, geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. To avoid toxicity to birds:

- 1. Do not treat areas larger than 15,000 sq. ft.
- Because of the migratory habits of certain waterfowl, do not apply in Nassau County, New York between November 1 and May 20.
- 3. Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates, since rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds, especially waterfowl.
- 4. Avoid overlapping treated areas.
- 5. Follow all watering instructions included within the directions for use, however, stop watering before puddling occurs.
- 6. Do not apply this product to sites occupied by waterfowl or to sites within 75 ft. of any body of water that may attract waterfowl, such as lakes or ponds.

D·z·n Granular Lawn Insect Control controls certain lawn pests on both grass and dichondra lawns. Apply this product with a fertilizer spreader. Refer to the tables that follow for use rates and spreader settings.



SPOT TREATMENT

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Ants: Apply one tablespoon of D·z·n Granular Lawn Insect Control over and around each individual ant hill.

Fire Ants: To aid in the control of fire ants in lawns and other recreational areas, apply 1 1/4 cups over, and 2 ft. around, each fire ant mound. Immediately after application, water in thoroughly. A minimum of 1 gallon of water should be applied to each mound area. Apply water gently to avoid disturbing ants. Use of high-pressure watering equipment may disturb the ants and cause migration, reducing product effectiveness. Treat as necessary.

Note: For best results, apply in cool weather, 65-80°F, or in early morning or late evening hours. Treat new mounds as they appear.

<u>Digger wasps</u>: Apply one tablespoon of D·z·n Granules in and around each individual ground nest opening. Make the application about dusk when the wasps are not active.

BAND TREATMENT AROUND HOUSE FOUNDATIONS

The following pests are commonly found around or near house foundations, and may enter the house:

Ants Crickets Millipedes
Brown dog ticks Earwigs Sowbugs
Clover mites Fleas Springtails (Collembola)


To control these pests, apply a 2-foot band of $D \cdot z \cdot n$ Granular Lawn Insect Control next to the house foundation. Distribute granules uniformly, using a rate of 8 ozs. per 100 sq. ft. of area (2 ft. x 50 ft.) treated. If necessary, repeat application at 3-week intervals.

Storage and Disposal

Storage: Store in original container in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area inaccessible to children and domestic animals. Do not store near fertilizers, herbicides, seeds, food, or feed. Do not reuse bag. Discard bag in trash.

<u>Pesticide Disposal</u>: Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.

<u>Container Disposal</u>: Do not reuse empty bag. Discard bag in trash.

Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates. Application rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds.

Avoid overlapping granules. Collect, mix into the soil, or cover granules that are spilled or are visible on soil surfaces.

Follow all watering instructions in the directions for use, however, stop watering before puddling occurs.
