Subject: Amendment- Addition of low odor claim and logo D.z.n Granular Lawn Insect Control EPA Registration Number 100-468 Your submission dated September 20, 1996

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA section 3(c)(7)(a), is acceptable provided that you:

- 1. Submit and/or cite all data or other material required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) or FIFRA section 4 when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
- 2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:
 - a. The "Low Odor Ciba Diazinon" logo may also appear on the label in addition to (or in place of) the claim "Low Odor-Contains Ciba Diazinon", which is based on use of the new process reduced odor diazinon manufacturing-use product, EPA Reg. No. 100-524. As indicated in the Agency's letter dated October 4, 1996 for EPA Reg. No. 100-528, me-too registrants of granular diazinon products formulated using 5% or less of the new process reduced odor diazinon manufacturing-use product, EPA Reg. No. 100-524, may also add the claim "Low Odor Contains Ciba Diazinon", with or without the associated logo, by Notification. The Agency

understands that Ciba will assist these me-too registrants, if necessary, by providing them a copy of Ciba's Agency approved labeling with the claim and logo to accompany their state registration applications, since the me-too registrants' labeling will not have been stamped, in accordance with the Agency's Notification procedures.

- b. Capitalize the "F" of "Federal" under the heading DIRECTIONS FOR USE.
- c. The Agency understands that from time to time you will update the existing table of recommended spreaders and their correct settings to reflect those items currently available in the commercial market. This updating may be done by Notification. The Agency assumes that certain older models, such as the metal Scott's Precision Flo series, will be included in the table for some time to assist consumers who have not recently purchased a new spreader.
- d. In the Environmental Hazards, revise "Do not apply directly to water, ta areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark." to read just "Do not apply directly to water.".
- 3. Submit three (3) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese), feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. To reduce risks to birds:

- 1. Do not treat areas larger than 15,000 sq. ft.
- Because of the migratory habits of certain waterfowl, do not apply in Nassau County, New York between November 1 and May 20.
- 3. Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates, since rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds, especially waterfowl.

SPOT TREATMENT

Ants: Apply one tablespoon of D.z.n Granular Lawn Insect Control over and around each individual ant hill.

Fire Ants: To aid in the control of fire ants in lawns and other recreational areas, apply 1 1/4 cups over, and 2 ft. around, each fire ant mound. Immediately after application, water in thoroughly. A minimum of 1 gallon of water should be applied to each mound area. Apply water gently to avoid disturbing ants. Use of high-pressure watering equipment may disturb the ants and cause migration, reducing product effectiveness. Treat as necessary.

Note: For best results, apply in cool weather, 65-80°F, or in early morning or late evening hours. Treat new mounds as they appear.

<u>Digger wasps</u>: Apply one tablespoon of D·z·n Granular Lawn Insect Control in and around each individual ground nest opening. Make the application about dusk when the wasps are not active.

BAND TREATMENT AROUND HOUSE FOUNDATION

The following pests are commonly found around or near house foundations and may enter the house:

Ants Crickets Millipedes
Brown dog ticks Earwigs Sowbugs
Clover mites Fleas Springtails (Collembola)

To control these pests, apply a 2-foot band of D·z·n Granular Lawn Insect Control next to the house foundation. Distribute granules uniformly, using a rate of 8 ozs. per 100 sq. ft. of area (2 ft. x 50 ft.) treated. If necessary, repeat application at 3-week intervals.

Storage and Disposal

Storage: Store in original container in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area inaccessible to children and domestic animals. Do not store near fertilizers, herbicides, seeds, food, or feed.

<u>Pesticide Disposal</u>: Securely wrap original container in several layers of newspaper and discard in trash.
