Your submission dated September 20, 1989

The amendments referred to above, submitted in connection with a registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, are acceptable provided the following revisions are made prior to release for shirment under the amended label:

- 1) The outline for the restricted use block should appear as on page 16 of the Agency's October 24, 1989 revision to the Diazinon Registration Standard, i.e., the top line of the box should be relocated upwards to appear over "RESTRICTED USE PESTICIDE".
- 2) Delete "Recommended for Agricultura) or Commercial Use Only". This limitation has been superseded by the Restricted Use classification.
- 3) In the directions for "Field Corn or Sweet Corn" (page 16 of the label), the handwritten addition creates an apparent discrepancy with the limitation to 3 applications per season. Presumably, you had intended to replace "Repeat application in 7 days if necessary." with "IT necessary, application may be repeated at 7-day intervals." rather than have the label carry both directions consecutively. If that is the case, the Agency recommends revising the retained sentence alightly, so that it would read "If necessary, application may be repeated twice at 7-day intervals.". This would then be followed immediately by "Do not make more than 3 applications per season.".
- 4) Delete the bee hazard statements from the Environmental Hazards. As noted in the Diazinon Registration Standard, such statements are not appropriate for granular products.




