by means of supplemental labeling
D.z.n 6000 Lawn & Garden Insect Control

Your submission dated May 27, 1997

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registrations under FIFRA section 3(c)(7)(a), are acceptable provided that you:

1. Submit and/or cite all data or other material required for registration/reregistration of your products under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) or FIFRA section 4 when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended (supplemental) labeling:
 - a) Revise the front panel claim "DEER TICKS WHICH MAY CAUSE LYME DISEASE" to either "DEER TICKS WHICH MAY TRANSMIT LYME DISEASE" or "DEER TICKS WHICH MAY CARRY LYME DISEASE".
 - b) In point number 5 of the Special Precautions, add a comma after "however". In point number 6, add a comma before "such as".
 - c) You may wish to capitalize or to not capitalize the tick names throughout the label for consistency with your other diazinon labels bearing these same pest claims.
 - d) While the lawn application table gives the correct rates, the user has been referred in the General Information to the full label for the appropriate spreader settings, however, the full

label does not give spreader settings to deliver either 3/4 lb. or 1/2 lb per 1000 sq. ft. Until such time as these uses are consolidated into the full label, the appropriate spreader settings for these uses should appear in the lawn application table of this Supplemental Label and the spreader setting referral should be deleted. If and when these uses are consolidated into the full label, then the spreader settings given on that full label will have to be expanded to allow for the 3 possible rates.

- e) In the Band Treatment Around House directions, revise the beginning of the first sentence to read "To control deer ticks [or Deer Ticks] which may transmit [or may carry] Lyme Disease and to control the Lone Star Tick,". In the next sentence replace "and" with "or" between the two application rates. Since this is a homeowner-use product, it would be useful to give some conversion of 1 oz. or 1.2 oz. into teaspoons or tablespoons of product. If you do, be sure to add the precaution "Do not use spoons for food use after use in measuring pesticides."

- 3. Submit three (3) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

D-z-n 6000 Lawn & Garden Insect Control works fast and application should be repeated only as directed to maintain control.

SPECIAL PRECAUTIONS TO REDUCE RISK TO BIRDS

Birds, especially waterfowl (ducks or geese) feeding or drinking on treated areas may be killed. To reduce risks to birds:

1. Do not treat areas larger than 15, 000 sq. ft.
2. Because of the migratory habits of certain waterfowl, do not apply in Nassau County, New York between November 1 and May 20.
3. Do not exceed maximum permitted label rates since rates above those recommended significantly increase potential hazards to birds, especially waterfowl.
4. Avoid overlapping treated areas.
5. Follow all watering instructions included within the directions for use, however stop watering before puddling occurs.
6. Do not apply this product to sites occupied by waterfowl or to sites within 75 ft. of any body of water that may attract waterfowl such as lakes or ponds.
7. If it is necessary to repeat application, wait a minimum of 3 weeks between applications. Make no more than 4 applications per year.

To control the deer tick, which may transmit Lyme Disease, and the lone star tick, follow the directions below. Repeat as necessary

Band Treatment Around House

Deer Ticks, Lone Star Ticks	To control deer ticks which may cause Lyme Disease and the Lone Star Tick, apply a 2-ft. band of D-z-n 6000 Lawn & Garden Insect Control next to the house foundation. Distribute granules uniformly, using a rate of 1.2 ozs.(deer ticks) and 1 oz.(lone star tick) per 100 sq. ft. of area (2 ft. x 50 ft.) treated. If necessary, repeat application at 3-week intervals.
