Adding Maximum Amount Used Per Year and Use Precaution
Regarding Post-Overseeding Application

The proposed amended supplemental labeling bearing claims for use of Barricade 65WG herbicide for the control of Poa annua in perennial ryegrass over-seeded golf courses (excluding golf course putting greens), lawns and sod nurseries has been reviewed as an amendment to the registration of the subject pesticide product under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA) as amended. This label is for perennial rye grass only at a minimum seeding rate of 350 pounds per acre. Use this product only in Arizona, Nevada and Texas only.
