- 2. Revise the "EPA Registration Number to read, "EPA Reg. No. 100-1433.
- 3. Update the fourth bullet point in the "If Swallowed" section of the FIRST AID statements on pages 2 and 18 to read, "Do not give anything to an unconscious person."
- 4. Update the Container Handling sections on pages 15 and 20 to remove the third sentence that reads, "Offer for recycling if available" as this statement already appears at the end of the paragraph.
- 5. On pages 2 and 18 under the Precautionary Statements, you may remove the last two sentences beginning with "Wash thoroughly with soap....." and ending with "....contaminated clothing before reuse." Such language is found in the User Safety Recommendations section.
- 6. On page 3, place the User Safety Requirements text in a box.
- 7. On page 6 remove language from the first sentence of the last "DO NOT" statement so that it reads, "DO NOT spray when conditions favor drift."
- 8. On page 7, carry over the Resistance Management heading to the following page.
- 9. On page 8 remove the language "beyond the target area" from the first sentence under Spray Drift Management so that the sentence reads "To avoid spray draft, do not apply when conditions favor drift."
- 10. On page 10, under the Application Instructions, add the turf restrictions language:
 - Do not apply by air
 - Do not apply through irrigation systems (chemigation)
- 11. On page 14 add in the seasonal maximum application for azoxystrobin as you have done for difenoconazole.
- 12. On page 15 and page 19, add a box around the Storage and Disposal text.
- 13. Update box 5 of your CSFs with the correct PM and team number the next time you submit them (Shaja Joyner/20).
- 14. Submit one copy of the revised final printed label for the record before the product is released for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA section 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

Azoxystrobin is toxic to freshwater and estuarine/marine fish and aquatic invertebrates Azoxystrobin can be persistent for several months or longer. Azoxystrobin has degradation products which have properties similar to chemicals which are known to leach through soil to ground water under certain conditions as a result of agricultural use. This chemical may leach into ground water if used in areas where permeable, particularly where the water table is shallow.

This product may impact surface water quality due to runoff of rain water. This is especially true for poorly draining soils and soils with shallow ground water. Breezeway fungicide is a broad-spectrum product containing two fungicides. It has preventative, systemic and curative properties. Breezeway fungicide provides excellent disease control of many major turfgrass diseases. Breezeway fungicide may be applied as a foliar spray and integrated into a resistance management program. All applications should be made according to the use directions that follow.

USE PRECAUTIONS AND RESTRICTIONS

FAILURE TO FOLLOW DIRECTIONS AND PRECAUTIONS ON THIS LABEL MAY RESULT IN TURF INJURY AND/OR POOR DISEASE CONTROL.

ATTENTION

DO NOT apply by air.

DO NOT apply through irrigation systems (chemigation)

DO NOT spray Breezeway fungicide where spray drift may reach apple trees. Breezeway fungicide is extremely phytotoxic to certain apple varieties.

DO NOT spray when conditions favor drift beyond area intended for application. Conditions which may contribute to drift include thermal inversion, wind speed and direction, sprayer nozzle/pressure combinations, spray droplet size, etc. Contact your State extension agent for spray drift prevention guidelines in your area.

USE INFORMATION

Application: Thorough coverage is necessary to provide good disease control. Make no more spray solution than is needed for application.

For control of foliar diseases, allow Breezeway fungicide applications to completely dry prior to irrigating. For control of soil-borne diseases, Breezeway fungicide can be watered in after application.

Adjuvants: When an adjuvant is to be used with this product, Syngenta recommends the use of a Chemical Producers and Distributors Association certified adjuvant.

Efficacy: Under certain conditions conducive to extended infection periods, use another registered fungicide for additional applications if the maximum amount of Breezeway fungicide has been used. If resistant isolates to Group 3 or Group 11 fungicides are present, efficacy can be reduced for certain diseases. The higher rates in the rate range and/or shorter spray intervals may be required under conditions of heavy infection pressure with highly susceptible varieties, or when environmental conditions are conducive to disease.

Breezeway fungicide is recommended for control of certain pathogens causing foliar, stem and root diseases including leaf and stem blights, leaf spots, patch diseases, mildews, anthracnose, fairy rings, molds, and rusts of turfgrass plants.

Integrated Pest Management (IPM): Breezeway fungicide should be integrated into an overall disease and pest management strategy whenever the use of a fungicide is required.

Sound turf management resulting in healthy, vigorous turf is the foundation of a good IPM program. Cultural practices such as proper choice of turf variety, nutrient management, proper cutting height, thatch management, and proper watering, drainage, and moisture stress management should be integrated with the use of fungicides to increase turf vigor and reduce susceptibility to disease. Immunoassay detection kits and Extension service diagnostic services can assist in the early and accurate identification of causal organisms and corresponding selection of the proper fungicide when required.

Resistance Management

GROUP 11 3 FUNGICIDES

Breezeway fungicide contains two fungicides - azoxystrobin, a strobilurin fungicide in Group 11 and difenoconazole, a triazole fungicide in Group 3. Fungal pathogens can develop resistance to products with the same mode of action when used repeatedly. Because resistance development cannot be predicted, use of this product should conform to resistance management strategies established for the crop and use area. Consult your local or State agricultural authorities for resistance management strategies that are complementary to those in this label. Resistance management strategies may include rotating with products having different modes of action or limiting the total number of applications per season. Syngenta encourages responsible resistance management to ensure effective long-term control of the fungal diseases on this label. Breezeway fungicide should not be alternated or tank mixed with any fungicide to which resistance has already developed.

Some turf disease pathogens are known to have developed resistance to products used repeatedly for their control. Breezeway fungicide should be alternated with other registered fungicides that have a different mode of action and to which pathogen resistance has not developed. Since Breezeway fungicide is a Qol fungicide (Group 11 fungicide) and a DMI fungicide (Group 3 fungicide), avoid alternations with other Qols such as pyraclostrobin, fluoxastrobin and trifloxystrobin or other DMI's such as propiconazole, tebuconazole and metaconazole. Addition of, or alternation to, a fungicide with Pythium activity such as Subdue® MAXX fungicide may be required if Pythium diseases are a major concern.

Turfgrass Tolerance: Breezeway fungicide plant tolerance has been found to be acceptable for all turfgrass species on the label, however, not all possible tank-mix combinations have been tested under all conditions. When possible, it is recommended to test the combinations on a small portion of the turf to ensure that a phytotoxic response will not occur as a result of application.

Spray Drift Management: To avoid spray drift, do not apply when conditions favor drift beyond the target area. The interaction of many equipment and weather related factors determine the potential for spray drift. AVOIDING SPRAY DRIFT AT THE APPLICATION SITE IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE APPLICATOR AND THE GROWER.

MIXING AND APPLICATION METHODS

Spray Equipment

Nozzles

- Equip sprayers with nozzles that provide accurate and uniform application.
- Nozzles should be the same size and uniformly spaced across the boom.
- Calibrate sprayer before use.

- It is suggested that screens be used to protect the pump and to prevent nozzles from clogging.
- · Screens placed on suction side of pump should be 16-mesh or coarser.
- · Do not place a screen in the recirculation line.
- Use 50-mesh or coarser screens between the pump and boom, and where required, at the nozzles.
- Check nozzle manufacturer's recommendations.

Pump

- Use a pump with capacity to:
 - (1) Maintain 35-40 psi at nozzles.
 - (2) Provide sufficient agitation in tank to keep mixture in suspension this requires recirculation of 10% of tank volume per minute.
- Use a jet agitator or liquid sparge tube for agitation.
- · Do not air sparge.

For more information on spray equipment and calibration, consult sprayer manufacturers and state recommendations. For specific local directions and spray schedules, consult the current state agricultural recommendations.

Mixing Instructions

Breezeway fungicide is a suspension concentrate (SC) formulation.

Thoroughly clean spray equipment before using this product.

Make up only the amount of spray required for the immediate use.

To prepare a spray solution, partially fill the spray tank with clean water and begin agitation. Add the specified amount of Breezeway fungicide to the tank, allowing time for good dispersion, then add an adjuvant, if recommended.

Do not use silicone based products with Breezeway fungicide due to possible phytotoxicity.

If tank mixes are required, products should be added to the spray tank in the following order: Breezeway fungicide, WG or dry flowable formulations, wettable powders and flowable (aqueous suspensions) products. Finish filling the spray tank to the desired volume to obtain the proper spray concentration.

Maintain agitation throughout the spraying operation. Do not allow spray mixture to stand overnight or for prolonged periods. If spray tank mixture is unsprayed for more than 18 hours (overnight), resuspend product with agitation for 20 minutes.

Page

Rinse spray tank thoroughly with clean water after each day's use and dispose of pesticide rinsate by application to an already treated area.

Breezeway Fungicide Alone (No Tank Mix)

- Add ½-¾ of the required amount of water to the spray or mixing tank.
- With the agitator running, add Breezeway fungicide to the tank.
- · Continue agitation while adding the remainder of the water.
- Begin application of the spray solution after Breezeway fungicide has completely dispersed into the mix water.
- Maintain agitation until all of the mixture has been sprayed.

Breezeway Fungicide + Tank Mixtures: Breezeway fungicide is usually compatible with many tank-mix partners registered for use on turf.

If tank mixes are desired, observe all directions, precautions and limitations on labeling of all products used. Consult compatibility charts or your local or State turf authority for compatibility information. Do not combine Breezeway fungicide in the spray tank with pesticides, surfactants, or fertilizers, unless compatibility charts or your own prior use has shown that the combination is physically compatible, effective, and non-injurious under your conditions of use.

To determine the physical compatibility of Breezeway fungicide with other products, use a jar test. Using a quart jar, add the proportionate amounts of the products to 1 qt. of water. Add wettable powders and water dispersible granular products first, then liquid flowables, and emulsifiable concentrates last. After thoroughly mixing, let stand for at least 5 minutes. If the combination remains mixed or can be remixed readily, it is physically compatible. Once compatibility has been proven, use the same procedure for adding required ingredients to the spray tank.

Mixing in the Spray Tank

- Add ½-¾ of the required amount of water to the spray or mixing tank.
- With the agitator running, add the tank-mix partner(s) into the tank in the same order as described above.
- Allow the material to completely dissolve and disperse into the mix water. Continue agitation while adding the remainder of the water and Breezeway fungicide to the spray tank.
- · Allow Breezeway fungicide to completely disperse.
- Spray the mixture with the agitator running.

Application Instructions

Breezeway fungicide may be applied with all types of spray equipment commonly used for making ground applications. Proper adjustments and calibration of spraying equipment to give good coverage is essential for good disease control.

Ground Application

- Apply in sufficient water to provide good coverage. Typical application volumes range from 30 to 450 gallons of spray per acre.
- Thorough coverage is necessary to provide good disease control.
