

Stadium is a broad-spectrum fungicide with systemic and curative properties recommended for the control of many important plant diseases. Stadium may be applied as a foliar spray in alternating spray programs or in tank mixes with other crop protection products. All applications must be made according to the use directions that follow.

USE INSTRUCTIONS

Ground Application:

Application: Thorough coverage is necessary to provide good disease control. Make up no more spray solution than is needed for application. Avoid spray overlap, as crop injury may occur.

Efficacy: Under certain conditions conducive to extended infection periods, use another registered fungicide for additional applications if maximum amount of Stadium has been used. If resistant isolates to Group 3, 11 or 12 fungicides are present, efficacy can be reduced. Under high disease pressure, it is recommended to use the highest rate and shortest interval.

Crop Tolerance: Plant tolerance has been found acceptable for all crops on the label; however, not all possible tank-mix combinations have been tested under all conditions. Nozzles

- Equip sprayers with nozzles that provide accurate and uniform application.
