1. The "Statements of Practical Treatment" will need to be updated in accordance with PR Notice 2000-3. (For guidance "www.epa.gov/oppsmsd1/PR_Notices/pr2000-3.pdf)
2. The Precautionary Statements will need to be updated according to the Label Manual 3rd Edition by stating:

Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage and skin burns. Do not get in eyes or on clothing. Wear protective eyewear (goggles, face shield, or safety glasses), protective clothing and rubber gloves. Harmful if swallowed. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling. Remove contaminated clothing and wash clothing before reuse.


3. Under the "Toilet Bowl/Urinal disinfectant/Cleaner Directions", add the statement: "Remove gross filth or heavy soil prior to application of product".

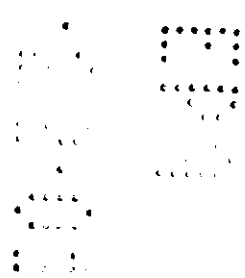

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STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF IN EYES: Hold eyelids open and flush with a steady, gentle stream of water for 15 minutes. Get medical attention. IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention. IF SWALLOWED: Call a doctor or get medical attention. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Drink promptly a large quantity of milk, egg whites, gelatin solution, or if these are not available, drink large quantities of water. Avoid alcohol.

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DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act as amended, for the pesticide, registered under EPA Reg. No. 106-72

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

USE: For institutional use only such as hospitals and nursing homes, schools and colleges, medical and dental offices, and veterinary clinics. This product is for use on floors, walls, mirrors, glass, metal surfaces, conductive flooring, painted surfaces, bowl surfaces, empty basins, noncritical medical devices, showers, and lavatory fixtures.

CLEANING AND DISINFECTING WASHABLE HARD NON-POROUS SURFACES:

Add one ounce of MAXIMA 128 to each gallon of water used. Always add MAXIMA 128 to premeasured water. Gently mix for a uniform solution. Apply solution by normal methods with brush, coarse spray devices, sponge, cloth or mop. Thoroughly wet all surfaces to be cleaned, then remove excess solution with a wrung out applicator. Treated surfaces should remain wet for 10 minutes. Remove gross filth mechanically by sweeping before cleaning begins. Fresh solution should be prepared daily or more often if the solution becomes diluted or soiled. Rinsing is not necessary unless floors are to be waxed. MAXIMA 128 is a complete product. Do not add other chemicals. Use only as directed.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CLEANING AND DECONTAMINATION AGAINST HIV-1 OF

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SURFACES/OBJECTS SOILED WITH BLOOD/BODY FLUIDS:

PERSONAL PROTECTION: Specific barrier protection items to be used when handling items soiled with blood or body fluids are disposable latex gloves, gowns, masks, or eye coverings.

CLEANING PROCEDURE: Blood and other body fluids must be thoroughly cleaned from surfaces and objects before application of MAXIMA 128. This pre-cleaning may be accomplished with any cleaning solution including MAXIMA 128.

DISPOSAL OF INFECTIOUS MATERIALS: Blood and other body fluids should be autoclaved and disposed of according to federal, state and local regulations for infectious waste disposal.

CONTACT TIME: Leave surfaces wet for 4 minutes. This contact time will not control other common types of viruses and bacteria.

TOILET BOWL/URINAL DISINFECTANT/CLEANER APPLICATION

1. Add 0.75 oz. to the bowl (0.75 gal.) and mix. Brush thoroughly over exposed surfaces and under the rim, allow to stand for 10 minutes and flush.

2. Empty toilet bowl or urinal and apply a 1 oz./gal. use-solution to exposed surfaces including under the rim with a cloth, mop, sponge or mechanical spray. Brush thoroughly over exposed surfaces and under the rim, allow to stand for 10 minutes and flush.

This product is not to be used as a terminal sterilant/high level disinfectant on any surface or instrument that (1) is introduced directly into the human body, either into or in contact with the bloodstream or normally sterile areas of the body, or (2) contacts intact mucous membranes but which does not ordinarily penetrate the blood barrier or otherwise enter normally sterile areas of the body. This product may be used to preclean or decontaminate critical or semi-critical medical devices prior to sterilization or high level disinfection.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Open dumping is prohibited.

Do not reuse empty container.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: Store in original container in areas inaccessible to small children. Keep container closed when not in use. Do not reuse empty container.
