

# DE-PESTER<sup>TM</sup>

## MALATHION 4% DUST

### RECOMMENDED USE

APPLY THOROUGH, FULL-COVERAGE APPLICATION AND REPEAT AS NEEDED.

**ALFALFA AND CLOVER:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, SPIDER MITES, POTATO LEAFHOPPER, SPITTLEBUGS, GRASSHOPPER AND ALFALFA WEEVIL LARVAE, APPLY 30 LBS. PER ACRE. FOR CONTROL OF SPOTTED ALFALFA APHID ON ALFALFA, APPLY 12 TO 15 LBS. PER ACRE BY GROUND EQUIPMENT OR 12 TO 20 LB. PER ACRE BY AIRPLANE; USE HIGHER DOSAGES ON TALLER ALFALFA. DO NOT APPLY TO ALFALFA IN BLOOM. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 7 DAYS OF HARVEST OR PASTURING.

**BLUEBERRIES:** FOR CONTROL OF BLUEBERRY MAGGOT, APPLY 25 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 1 DAY OF HARVEST.

**COTTON:** FOR CONTROL OF SPIDER MITES, APHIDS, LEAFHOPPERS, WHITEFLIES, COTTON LEAF WORM, LEAF PERFORATOR AND THRIPS, APPLY 10 TO 25 LBS. PER ACRE.

**CRANBERRIES:** FOR CONTROL OF LEAFHOPPER AND BLACK-HEADED FIREWORMS, APPLY 35 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**GATES:** FOR CONTROL OF NITIDULID BEETLES, APPLY THOROUGHLY TO EACH CLUSTER, NOT EXCEEDING 50 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 7 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**GRAPES:** FOR CONTROL OF LEAFHOPPERS AND SPIDER MITES, APPLY 20 TO 40 LBS. PER ACRE AND REPEAT AS NEEDED. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**STRAWBERRIES:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS AND SPIDER MITES, APPLY 40 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**WALNUTS:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS AND SPIDER MITES, APPLY 40 TO 60 LBS. PER ACRE.

### VEGETABLES

**BEANS:** FOR CONTROL OF MEXICAN BEAN BEETLE AND LEAFHOPPERS, APPLY 30 TO 40 LBS. PER ACRE AND REPEAT AS NEEDED. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 1 DAY OF HARVEST.

**CARROTS, CAULIFLOWER AND ENDIVE:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, APPLY 30 TO 35 LBS. PER ACRE, EXCEPT APPLY 50 LBS. PER ACRE TO CAULIFLOWER. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 7 DAYS OF HARVEST.

### RECOMMENDED USES (CONT'D) (VEGETABLES)

**CUCURBITS (CUCUMBERS, MELONS, PUMPKINS, AND SQUASH):** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, SPIDER MITES AND LEAFHOPPERS, APPLY 30 TO 35 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY UNLESS PLANTS ARE DRY. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**LETTUCE:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, SPIDER MITES, LEAFHOPPERS AND CABBAGE LOOPER, APPLY 30 TO 40 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 7 DAYS OF HARVEST OF HEAD LETTUCE OR WITHIN 14 DAYS OF LEAF LETTUCE.

**MUSHROOMS:** FOR CONTROL OF PHORID AND SCIARID FLIES, APPLY 10 TO 15 LBS. PER ACRE OR 2 LBS. PER 60 FOOT OF SINGLE HOUSE AS SOON AFTER PICKING AS POSSIBLE AND REPEAT AS NECESSARY USUALLY TWICE A WEEK. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 1 DAY OF HARVEST.

**ONIONS:** FOR CONTROL OF THRIPE, APPLY 30 TO 40 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST.

**PEAS:** FOR CONTROL OF PEA APHID, APPLY 25 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 3 DAYS OF HARVEST, 7 DAYS IF VINES ARE TO BE USED FOR FORAGE.

**POTATOES:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS AND LEAFHOPPERS, APPLY 30 TO 40 LBS. PER ACRE.

**SPINACH:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, APPLY 30 TO 35 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 7 DAYS OF HARVEST.

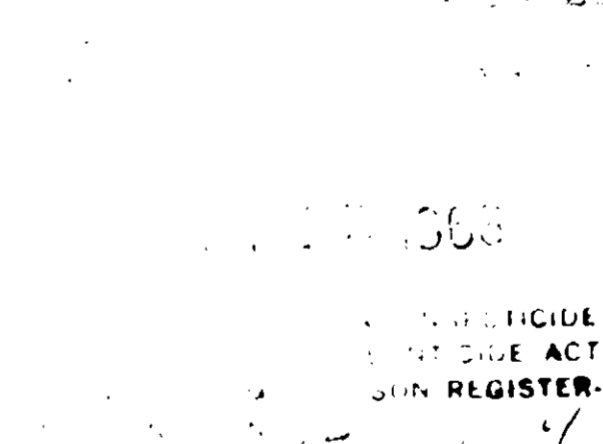
**TOMATOES:** FOR CONTROL OF APHIDS, SPIDER MITES AND TOMATO RUSSET MITE, APPLY 30 TO 45 LBS. PER ACRE. DO NOT APPLY WITHIN 1 DAY OF HARVEST.

# CAUTION
