## **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

## FOR CONTROL OF EARLY-SEASON THrips AND COTTON FLEAHOPPER:

Apply 8 to 15 pounds of Planters 7% Sevin Dust per acre on appearance of insects.

**FOR CONTROL OF MID- AND LATE-SEASON BOLL WEEVIL, BOLLWORM, COTTON LEAFWORM, LYCUS AND STINK BUGS, AND COTTON LEAF PERFORATOR:** Apply 15 to 20 pounds of Planters 7-10% Silvex Dust per acre at from five to seven days intervals until no signs of insects

Aphid populations will usually be suppressed when this insecticide is used on a regular schedule of treatments. Where no-till infections are encountered, use a recommended miticide. Sevin is believed compatible with all pesticides commonly used on cotton. Do not apply after bolls open. Do not graze treated fields or feed them to dairy or meat animals.
