Application of this product by Belly-Grinder is prohibited.

#### **AERIAL SPRAY DRIFT MANAGEMENT**

Avoiding spray drift at the application site is the responsibility of the applicator. The interaction of many equipment-and-weather-related factors determine the potential for spray drift. The applicator and the grower are responsible for considering all these factors when making decisions.

The following drift management requirements must be followed to avoid off-target drift movement from aerial applications. These requirements do not apply to applications using dry formulations.

- 1. The distance of the outer most nozzles on the boom must not exceed ¼ the length of the wingspan or rotor.
- 2. Nozzles must always point backward parallel with the air stream and never be pointed downwards more than 45 degrees.

Where states have more stringent regulations, they should be observed.

The applicator should be familiar with and take into account the information covered in the <u>Aerial Drift</u> <u>Reduction Advisory Information</u>.

#### Aerial Drift Reduction Advisory Information

Aerial Drift Reduction Advisory: This section is advisory in nature and does not supercede the mandatory label requirements.

#### Swath Adjustment

When applications are made with a crosswind, the swath will be displaced downwind. Therefore, on the up and downwind edges of the field, the applicator must compensate for this displacement by adjusting the path of the aircraft upwind. Swath adjustment distance should increase, with increasing drift potential (higher wind, smaller drops, etc.).

#### Wind

Drift potential is lowest between wind speeds of 2-10 mph. However, many factors, including droplet size and equipment type determine drift potential at any given speed. Application should be avoided below 2 mph due to variable wind direction and high inversion potential. NOTE: Local terrain can influence wind patterns. Every applicator should be familiar with local wind patterns and how they affect spray drift.

#### Sensitive Areas

The pesticide should only be applied when the potential for drift to adjacent sensitive areas (e.g. residential areas, non-target bodies of water, known habitat for threatened or endangered species, non-target crops) is minimal (e.g. when wind is blowing away from the sensitive areas).

Use minimum or lower rates (see chart below) in areas with open water containing low organic matter and little or no emergent vegetation. Use maximum rate in areas with high organic matter and dense vegetative cover, such as: swamps, marshes, or tidal waters.

This product may not be reapplied within 7 days of the date of the initial application unless monitoring indicates that larval populations have reestablished, or weather conditions have rendered initial treatments ineffective.

#### SPOT APPLICATIONS

This product may be applied as a spot treatment prehatch to catch basins and similar areas which breed mosquitoes. Follow Use Directions for Broadcast Applications.

CONTAINER BREEDING SITES (Applications to tire piles and other container breeding sites to control *Aedes albopictus* or other container breeding mosquito species.)

Broadcast Application: Apply to sides and tops of tire piles using hand held granular application equipment, vehicle-mounted blower applicators or other suitable equipment for application of granular larvicides.
