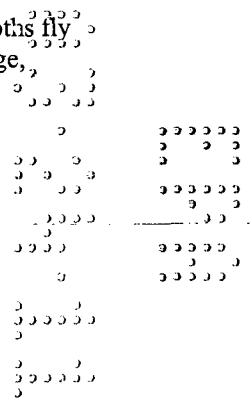
DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

In New York, this product may NOT be applied to any grass or turf area (lawns) within 100 feet of a water body (lake, pond, river, stream, wetland, or drainage ditch).

In New York State, do make a single repeat application of Bifenthrin 0.1% Lawn Granules if there are signs of renewed insect activity, but not sooner than two weeks after the first application.

Apply when insect activity or damage is first observed in the lawn (lawn thins and turns brown or moths fly from the grass when you mow). Don't treat just the browned area of lawn. To prevent further damage, treat entire lawn.



Surface Feeding Lawn Insects	
Use Dexol Lawn Insect Bifen 0.1% for the control of ants, including Carpenter, Red Harvester, Odorous Pyramid, Pharaoh (Sugar) Ants, Armyworms (including Fall Armyworms), Billbug (Including Bluegrass Billbug), Chiggers, Chinch Bugs, Crickets, Cutworms (including Black Cutworms), Earwigs, Grasshoppers, Mealybugs, Sod Webworms (Lawn Moth), and Weevils (including Hyperodes and Bluegrass). Argentine Ants, Black Turf Ants, Black Turfgrass Ataenius, Fleas (including Cat Fleas), Leafhoppers, Spiders (including Brown Recluse Spiders) and Ticks (including Brown Dog Ticks)	Uniformly apply 2.4 [1.2] pounds over a 1,000 [500] sq. ft. area of lawn. Water thoroughly immediately after application.
Centipedes, Millipedes, Pavement Ants, Mole Crickets (including Tawny Mole Crickets)	Uniformly apply 4.8 [1.2] pounds over a 1,000 [250] sq. ft. area of lawn. For mole crickets, treat in late spring. Water thoroughly immediately after application.
Home Foundation Barrier Treatment	
Evenly apply granules in a 2-foot wide band along the house or building foundation. Use 0.6 pounds to 1.2 pounds per 500 square feet (2 feet wide X 250 feet long). Water thoroughly after application.	
Spot Treatment	
Ants nesting outdoors: Apply to thoroughly cover the nest or mound (1 to 2 teaspoons). Gently sprinkle with water after application.
