



7 DIRECTIONS

MIXING SPPAYS: Wash Ferbam into spray tank through a deep screen, or make a thick paste with a little water, then dilute it and add to spray tank while filling. SPPEADER-STICKER: The addition of Arcadian Filmfast®, Genifilm® "L", or Plyach will improve coverage on foliage which is difficult to wet.

KEEP AWAY FROM FIRE AND SPARKS. LOSAGES BELOW ARE BASED ON THE AMOUNT OF FERBAM TO BE USED IN 100 GALLONS OF WATER.

APPLES: For Apple Scab, use 1 to 152 pounds. Apr y in pre-bloom, calyx and early cover sarrys. Reduce to % pound in later cover sprays. When used in combination with sulfur, Ferbam is recommended at ½ pound, plus 3 pounds of micronfine wettable sulfur (Arcadian Micro-Dritomic® Sulfur). Do Not use sulfur if russeting has been a problem. Do Not use ferbam on tender varieties such as Golden Delignous as it may contribute to fruit russcring.

For Codar Apple Rust Diseases keep foliage and 'ruit covered during infection periods. Use an above, plus a special bloom spray of 1/2 prund.

For Black Rot (Frog-eye) (Leaf and Fruit Spot), Apple Blotch, Bitter Rot, Scoty Blotch and Fry Speck, use 1 to 112 pounds.

CHERRIES: 1: Leaf Spot, use 11/2 prinds. Apply 4 sprays, at petal-fall, 2 and / weeks after petal-fall and immediately after harvest, for Brown Rot, use 13/2 pounds. Apply at porcern, in this com and petal-liath and starting 2 to 3 weeks before harvest apply one or more prays at 7 to 10 day in ervals. PTARS: For 10 ib, use 1½ pounds. Apply in pink, cary. Pret cover spray and second ocver spray, For Fabraea (Leaf Blight and Fruit Spot) and Sooty Blotch, use I pound to the summa aprays.

PLACHES: Fil Peach Leaf Gurl and Shot Hole (forgus, ese 1½ to 3 pounds. Apply at dormant an puppern. For Brown Rot Blossom Blight, use Die to 2 pounds. Apply at pink hud and 25% to 75% of full bloom. For Fur coccum Canker (constriction) in New Jersey and Massachuselts. use 11/2 pour 's. Apply before block, (start-

ing in early March) and after horvest as long as weather permits. Space sprays 7 to 10 days apart.

GRAPES. For Black Rot. Use 2 pounds. Apply just before bicom, immediately after bloom and 2 weeks after bloom. Do Not use more than 6 pounds per acre per application.

CRANBERRIES: For Fruit Rots, use 3 prunds. Apply at mic'-bloom and repeat at 2 week intervals, for a total of 3 applications. Do Not use more than 3 parness per acre per application.

NOTE: Do Not use on apples or pears within 7 days of har est, on charries within 10 days of harvest, on peaches within 21 days of harvest, on grapes later than 14 days after berries to ich or on cranbarries within 28 days after mid-bloom.

OTHER CROPS

CABBAGE: For Downy Mildew in plant beds, use 11/2 pounds. Make 2 to 3 applications a week, starting when plants emerge Do Not use later than 60 days before harvest. Do Not use more than 21/3 pounds per acre per application.

TOBACCO: For Blue Mold in plant beds. use at the rate of 3 to 4 pounds per 100 gallons of water. Us the 4-pound rate if equipment and timing are not perfect. Apply 3 gallons per 100 square yards when plants are small. Increase to 6 gallons as plants are ready for transplanting. Start applications when leaves are the size of a dime or when Blue Mold first appears in your area. Apply twice a week until time for transplanting.

ORNAMENTALS: For Black Spet and Rust of Roses; Septoria Leaf Spot of Chiye santhemums; Snapdragon Rust; Bactarial Leaf Spot of Geraniums; Alternaria Blight and RUST of Carnations; Botrytis Rot of Cyclomen; Botrytis Might (tulin fire) of. Tulips; Tuniper Rust : n.d Laurel Leaf Spots -use 1 to 11/2 pounds. Apply at 7 to 10 day intervals as needed. For Petal Builds of-Azaleas and Camellias - use 1 to 142 potthids. Apply at 3 to 5 day intervals as needed during infection periods.

SMALL QUANTITIES: Use at the rate of 4, 6 or 8 teaspoonfuls in 1 gallon of under (equivalent to 1, 1½ or 2 pounds in 10) gallons of water).
