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c. Per the 2,4-D RED and the acute toxicity review, the PPE section must be revised to read:

"Mixers, loaders and all other handlers must wear:

Long-sleeved shirt and long pants,

Shoes and socks,

Chemical-resistant gloves made of waterproof material,

Goggle or face shield, and

Chemical-resistant apron when mixing, loading, cleaning up spills or equipment, or otherwise exposed to the concentrate."

- d. The mechanical transfer engineering control text is no longer needed and may be deleted from the label.
- e. Per the 2,4-DP-p and MCPP-p REDs, the text below in the bold type must be added to the User Safety Requirements text currently on the label:

"Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry.

Discard clothing and other absorbent materials that have been drenched or heavily contaminated with this product's concentrate. Do not reuse them."

f. Per the 2,4-D, MCPP-p and 2,4-DP-p REDs, the first 2 sentences in the Environmental Hazard section must be revised to read:

"This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates and may adversely affect non-target plants. Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the high water mark."

g. A Non-Agricultural Use Requirements box is not needed and should be deleted from the label.

The text "For turf use, the maximum number of broadcast applications per treatment site is 2 per year" and "Do not enter or allow people (or pets) to enter the treated area until sprays have dried" must remain on the label.

h. Spray drift text must be added to the label and should read:

"Spray Drift Management

A variety of factors including weather conditions (e.g., wind directions, wind speed, temperature, relative humidity) and method of can influence pesticide drift. The applicator must evaluate all factors and make appropriate adjustments when applying this product.

Droplet Size

Use only Medium or coarser spray nozzles according to ASAE (S572) definition for standard nozzles.

Wind Speed

Do not apply at wind speeds greater than 10 mph. Only apply this product if the wind direction favors on-target deposition and there are not sensitive areas (including, but not limited to, residential areas, bodies of water, known habitat for nontarget species, nontarget crops) within 250 feet downwind.

Temperature Inversions

If applying at wind speeds less than 3 mph, the applicator must determine if: a) conditions of temperature inversion exist, or b) stable atmospheric conditions exist at or below nozzle height. Do not make applications into areas of temperature inversions or stable atmospheric conditions.

Susceptible Plants

Do not apply under circumstances where spray drift may occur to food, forage, or other plantings that might be damaged or crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or consumption. Per the MCPP-p RED, Add: "The maximum application rate for spot treatment is 1.2 lbs as MCPP-p per acre per application" and remove any conflicting text.

-Roadsides, Rights-of-way, and other similar non-crop areas: Add:

"Limited to 2 applications per year."

An area to be treated must be added to the label for spot treatment and the application rate must not exceed the allowable rate listed in the MCPP-p RED (1.2 lbs ae per acre per application).

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For control of woody plants:

The directions to "add 1 to 1 ½ gallons (up to 1.86 lbs ae 2,4-D, and 0.93 lbs ae each of 2,4-DP-p and MCPP-p) of this product to 100 gallons of water applying 200 to 600 gallons of spray mixture (11.16 lbs ae 2,4-D and 5.58 lbs ae each of 2,4-DP-p and MCPP-p) per 43,500 sq ft exceeds the allowable rate of 0.75 lbs ae for 2,4-DP-p and MCPP-p for broadcast use and 1.2 lbs ae MCPP-p for spot treatment, the most restrictive rates as specified in the REDs. The label must be revised.

Add: "Limited to 2 applications per year."

GENERAL INFORMATION

This product is a stable solution containing a mixture of three herbicides. It is nonflammable. It is for use on Ornamental Turf and Non-Cropland areas. Not for use on turf being grown for sale or other commercial use as sod, or for commercial seed production, or for research purposes.

CARE MUST BE TAKEN TO AVOID DRIFT OF SPRAY MISTS TO NON-TARGET susceptible plants such as cotton, vegetables, flowers, ornamentals, shrubs, trees, and other desirable plants. Do not spray near these plants. Do not spray on carpetgrass, dichondra, nor on grasses where desirable clovers are present. Except as noted, use a lawn type sprayer with coarse spray as wind drift is less likely. Avoid fine mists. Do not spray exposed roots of desirable plants. Use the higher rate for hard-to-kill weeds. Do not exceed specified application dosages for any area. Do not apply to newly seeded grasses until well established. Avoid applying during excessively dry or hot periods unless irrigation is used. Avoid broadcast applications when air temperature exceeds 90 degrees. When using small, spot treatment applications in temperature over 90 degrees, turf injury may occur.

When treating Carpetgrass and St. Augustine grass, avoid broadcast applications when air temperature exceeds 80°F. When air temperatures exceed 80°F, limit application to spot treatment only.

For optimum results, (1) turf should not be mowed 1to 2 days before and following application; (2) do not apply if rainfall is expected within 48 hours; nor should lawns be irrigated (watered) for 48 hours following application. Reseed no sooner than 3 to 4 weeks after application of this product. Adding oil, wetting agent, or other surfactant to the spray may be used to increase effectiveness on weeds but doing so may reduce selectivity to turf resulting in turf damage. Clean and rinse spray equipment using soap or detergent and water and rinse thoroughly before reuse for other sprays. Failure to observe the above precautions may result in injury.

This product can be mixed with some liquid fertilizers or liquid iron materials. Because liquid fertilizers and liquid iron differ in pH, free ammonia content, density, salt concentration, and percentage of water, a compatibility test is recommended prior to mixing in the application equipment. All regulations, either State or Federal, relating to the application of liquid fertilizers or liquid iron and this product must be strictly followed.

ORNAMENTAL TURF

(Golf Courses, Cemeteries, Parks, Sports Fields, Turfgrass, Lawns and Other Grass Areas)

Cool Season Grasses - such as bluegrass, fescue, and rye: Apply this product at a rate of 3 to 4 pints per acre in sufficient water for good coverage, 40 to 80 gallons of water per acre (1 to 2 gallons of water per 1,000 square feet is normal). For small lawns, apply 5 to 7 teaspoons in 1 gallon of water per 1,000 square feet.

Warm Season Grasses - such as St. Augustine, bahia, common Bermuda, centipede and zoysia grasses: Apply this product at a maximum rate of 2 to 3 pints in up to 150 gallons of water per acre (2/3 to 1-1/3 fluid ounce. in 3 gallons of water per 1,000 square feet). Do not spray St. Augustine, common Bermuda or centipede grasses if stressed from heat, drought, etc. Slight turf yellowing should disappear after about 1 week. Exercise care when applying during growth stages from dormancy to green-up and from green-up to dormancy. Note: Some hybrid Bermuda grasses may be sensitive to this product. Contact your local extension service weed control specialist.

Bentgrass Turf: On closely mowed bentgrass, other than golf course greens and tees, apply this product at a maximum rate of 2/3 ounce in 3 gallons water per 1,000 square feet (1-3/4 pints per acre) in May or

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mid-August through September when weeds are actively growing. Exercise care when applying to avoid overdosing bentgrass or turf injury may result. Slight turf yellowing should disappear after about 1 week.

Low-Volume Applicator: When using a Low-Volume Applicator (such as Lawn Doctor's "Turf Tamer") apply this product at a rate of 3 to 4 pints per acre (1.1 fluid ounce to 1.5 fluid ounce. in 1/2 gallon of water per 1,000 square feet).

Herbi[™] Controlled Droplet Applicator: Add 2 pints of this product to the 5 pint Herbi bottle, then fill with 3 pints of water, or 2-1/2 pints of water and 1/2 pint of a surfactant while agitating the solution. For warm season grasses, apply 1-1/2 pints of this product to 3-1/2 pints of water. While walking at approximately 1 pace (3 feet) per second; spray entire contents over 33,000 square feet (3/4 of an acre). Do not overlap (double coverage) at edge of spray patterns. Reduced rates (use 1/2 of rate shown above) of this product must be applied when grass is stressed from heat, drought, etc.

Limitations and Restrictions for Ornamental Turf:

- For broadcast treatments, do not apply more than 9 pints of product per acre per application. Do not apply more than 18 pints of product per acre per season, excluding spot treatments. Do not make more than 2 applications per year with a minimum of 30 days between applications.
- For spot treatments do not apply more than 25 pints of product per acre per application. Do not make
 more than 2 applications per year with a minimum of 30 days between applications. Broadcast
 application is prohibited at this rate. A spot treatment is defined as a treatment area not greater than
 1,000 square feet per acre.

NON-CROPLAND

(Fencerows, Hedgerows, Roadsides, Ditches, Rights-of-Way, Utility Power Lines, Railroads, Airports, and Industrial Sites)

For the control of broadleaf weeds: Mix at a rate of 1/3 to 1 gallon of this product per 50 to 300 gallons of water. This mixture will cover 43,500 square feet. Thoroughly saturate all weeds with spray mixture. Apply anytime between the time when plants come into full leaf (spring) to when the plants begin to go dormant. Best results are obtained when weeds are young and actively growing. Do not cut weeds until herbicide has translocated throughout the plant causing root death. For small broadleaf weeds, use the lower rate. Heavy, dense stands require the higher rate with high water volume. For small (spot) applications with small tank sprayers, apply at the rate of 4 ounces of this product per gallon of water and spray to thoroughly wet all foliage.

For control of woody plants: Apply to both stems and foliage anytime from the time foliage is completely matured until the time plants start to go dormant. All leaves, stems and suckers must be completely wet to the ground line for effective control. Regrowth may be anticipated on the more resistant species. Add 1 to 1-1/2 gallons of this product to 100 gallons of water applying 200 to 600 gallons of spray mixture per 43,500 sq. ft. depending upon the height and thickness of the brush. Mix thoroughly before spraying.

Limitations and Restrictions for Non-Cropland:

- For postemergence non-cropland annual and perennial weeds, do not apply more than 3.25 gallons product per acre. Do not make more than 2 applications per year with a minimum of 30 days between applications.
- For postemergence non-cropland woody plants, do not apply more than 6.5 gallons product per acre. Do not make more than 1 application per year.
- Applications to non-cropland areas are not applicable to treatment of commercial timber or other plants being grown for sale or other commercial use, or for commercial seed production, or for research purposes.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

PESTICIDE STORAGE: This product should be stored in its original container in a cool, dry locked place out of the reach of children and out of direct sunlight. Do not use or store near heat or open flame.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: To avoid wastes, use all material in this container by application according to label directions. If waste cannot be avoided, offer remaining product to a waste disposal facility or pesticide disposal program (often such programs are run by state or local governments or by industry).

CONTAINER DISPOSAL:

Nonrefillable Containers 5 Gallons or Less: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container 1/4 full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by State and local authorities. Plastic containers are also disposable by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned stay out of smoke.

Nonrefillable containers larger than 5 gallons: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling if available. Triple rinse or pressure rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container 1/4 full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat this procedure two more times. Pressure rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank or collect rinsate for later use or disposal. Insert pressure rinsing nozzle in the side of the container, and rinse at about 40 psi for at least 30 seconds. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip.

Refillable containers larger than 5 gallons: Refillable container. Refill this container with pesticide only. Do not reuse this container for any other purpose. Cleaning the container before final disposal is the responsibility of the person disposing of the container. Cleaning before refilling is the responsibility of the refiller. To clean the container before final disposal, empty the remaining contents from this container into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container about 10% full with water and, if possible, spray all sides while adding water. Agitate vigorously or recirculate water with the pump for two minutes. Pour or pump rinsate into application equipment or rinsate collection system. Repeat this rinsing procedure two more times.
