



PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

WARNING

FIRST AID STATEMENT

Have the product container or label with you when calling a poison control center or doctor, or going for treatment.

IF IN EYES:

Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

IF SWALLOWED: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING:

IMPORTANT

Veteran 166 Herbicide may cause injury to desirable trees or plants, particularly beans, cotton, flowers, fruit trees, grapes, ornamentals, peas, potatoes, soybeans, sunflowers, tobacco, tomatoes, and other broadleaf plants when contacting their roots, stems, or foliage.

Do not treat areas where the possible downward movement into the soil or surface washing may cause contact of harbicide with the roots of desirable plants such as trees and shrubs.

To avoid injury to desirable plants, equipment used for VETERAN 10G Herbicide should be thoroughly cleaned before reuse to handle or apply any other chemicals.

VETERAN 1CG Herbicide may temporarily stunt or eliminate the growth of grass in the treated areas.

Pasture and rangeland grasses may be grazed or harvested for feed (green or dry) for

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lactating dairy animals 60 days following treatment. There is no waiting period between treatment and grazing for animals other than lactating dairy animals. Remove meat animals from treated areas 30 days prior to slaughter.

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APPLICATION RATES AND TIMING: VETERAN 10G Herbicide may be applied using standard ground or air granular application equipment for broadcast or spot treatments. VETERAN 10G Herbicide is activated when there is sufficient moisture to move the herbicide into the root zone of plants to be controlled. Application may be made any time when soil is not frozen. However, best performance usually occurs when treatments are made in the Spring just before or during active growth of the weeds and brush. CONSULT YOUR LOCAL OR STATE AUTHORITIES FOR THE BEST TIMING OF APPLICATION.

Application rates are given below. Use the higher level of listed rate range when treating dense vegetative growth.

- For spot treatments, use 1/2 to 1 pound of product per 1,000 square feet for control of listed ANNUAL, BIENNIAL and PERENNIAL weeds.
- For spot treatments, use 1 to 2 pounds of product per 1,000 square feet for noted (*) ANNUAL, BIENNIAL and PERENNIAL weeds.
- For spot treatments, use 2 pounds of product per 1,000 square feet for control of listed WOODY BRUSH and VINES. Uniformly spread granules over the area where the plant roots are growing.

In most cases, these treatments will not control weed seedlings which germinate one to two years after treatment. Once the effect of the herbicide has been lost, a follow-up program for seedling control or other cultural practices should be instituted.

For broadcast application, do not use more than 20 pounds of VETERAN 10G per treated acre per year.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

PROHIBITIONS: Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

STORAGE: Store in original container in a well-ventilated area away from fertilizer, feed or foodstuffs and separated from other pesticides.

PESTICIDE DISPOSAL: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Triple rinse (or equivalent) plastic pails. For paper or plastic bags, or for fiber drums with liners, completely empty into application equipment by shaking and tapping container.
