The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended is acceptable provided that you:

- 1. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, per the acute toxicity review, the appropriate signal word is "WARNING".
- 2. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, per the acute toxicity review, the "If in Eyes" must appear prior to the other statements. Also, make the "If Inhaled" statement appear last.
- 3. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, per the acute toxicity review, the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals statement must read "Causes substantial but temporary eye injury. Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Do not get in eyes or on clothing. Avoid contact with skin." Also add the statement "Wear goggles or face shield." to the Residential Use Label.
- 4. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, per the acute toxicity review, the sensitization text "This product may cause skin sensitization reactions in some people" is no longer needed per the acute toxicity review.
- 5. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, the statement "MCPA may be toxic to fish, aquatic invertebrates, and aquatic plants" is to be deleted.

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- 6. On both the Occupational and Residential Use Labels, add the statements "Residential Turf
 Do not apply more than 1.5 lb ae/acre/year (registrant state this in amount of formulation per acre per year).
 "Do not apply more than 2 applications per year with a minimum retreatment interval of 21 days."
- 7. On the Occupational Use Label, add "Personal Protective Equipment" language "Mixers, loaders, applicators and all other handlers must wear: Long sleeved shirt and long pants, Shoes and socks, Goggles or face shield, and Chemical resistant gloves made of any waterproof material."
- 8. On the Occupational Use Label, for the "User Safety Requirements" add statement "Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washable, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry."
- 9. On the Occupational Use Label, add the "User Safety Recommendations" statement, "Users should wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet.

User should remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash thoroughly and change into clean clothing.

User should remove clothing immediately if pesticide gets inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing."

- 10. On the Occupational Use Label, add the language "Triclopyr has properties and characteristics associated with chemicals detected in groundwater. The use of this chemical in areas where soils are permeable, particularly where the water table is shallow, may result in groundwater contamination."
- 11. On the Occupational Use Label, in the General Precautions and Restrictions section add "Do not enter or allow others to enter the treated area until dusts have settled. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or others persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application."

- 12. On the Occupational Use Label, the statement "The maximum application rate is 9 lbs ai/acre/year" must be revised to indicate that this applies only to uses other than golf course and residential turf uses.

 User should remove eyewear immediately after handling this product."
- 15. On the Residential Use Label, revise the Environmental Hazard to read "Do not apply directly to water. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Runoff of this product will be reduced by avoiding applications when rainfall is forecasted to occur within 48 hours. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate."
- 16. On the Residential Use Label, replace the heading "Storage" with Pesticide Storage" under the "Storage and Disposal" section. Also, change the disposal instructions to read "If empty: Do not reuse this container. Place in trash or offer for recycling if available. If partly filled: Call your local solid waste agency or [toll free number which meets the criteria in paragraph II.E. of this notice] for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain."
- 17. On the Residential Use Label, in the General Precautions and Restrictions section add "Do not allow people or pets to enter treated area until dusts have settled. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact any person or pet, either directly or through drift. Keep people and pets out of the area during application."
- 18. On the Residential Use Label, any reference to "use on… Parks, Cemeteries, Golf Courses (Fairways, Aprons, Tees and Roughs), and similar non-crop areas" is not appropriate for a "Non-Commercial" product and must be deleted from the label.

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19. Change "To the extent permitted by law" to read "To the extent consistent with applicable law", wherever it appears under the terms and conditions of use.

Entry Restrictions: Do not enter or allow others to enter the treated area until dusts have settled. Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.

The maximum application rate is 9 lbs. active ingredient per acre per year.

This product may be used on Bahia, Bent (excluding golf course greens and tees), Bermuda, Blue Grass, Fescue, Rye, and Zoysia grass. Avoid applications to Centipede and St. Augustine grass unless injury can be tolerated. Do not use on Dichondra, Carpetgrass, or where desirable clovers are present.

WHEN TO APPLY: Best results are obtained when weeds are growing actively in spring or early fall. Avoid contact with desirable shrubs, trees, vegetables, flowers, or desirable plants; especially when applying with a rotary (spinner) type spreader. Do not reseed for at least 3 to 4 weeks after application. Do not apply to newly seeded or sodded lawn until after 3 mowings. For optimum results (1) Avoid mowing 1 to 2 days before and after application; (2) Apply when grass is moist (after a rain, sprinkling or dew); (3) Avoid unnecessary disturbances, including watering of treated areas for 48 hours after application. Watering will wash off weed killing material; and (4) Avoid applying if rainfall is expected within 48 hours following treatment. Possible retreatment in approximately 30 days may be necessary if lawn is heavily overrun with weeds or if adverse low moisture conditions prevail and weeds are in a state of poor growth. Do not exceed recommended rates because damage to turf may occur.

NOTE: When applying to listed Warm Season Grasses - under conditions of inadequate moisture, high temperature and high humidity, over-application may cause minor transitory discoloration. It is recommended that during hot, dry conditions, application rates should be reduced 50% to avoid possible dehydration or browning of grass.

HOW TO APPLY: This 20 pound bag should be used on 5,000 square feet. Apply evenly with a lawn spreader as a one-pass application. A two-pass application, criss-crossing the area at half the rate each time is also acceptable.

The following settings are <u>approximate</u> for applying contents of this package at a suggested rate of 4 pounds per 1,000 square feet. Settings are based on an average walking speed. Reduce setting for slower speed; raise setting for higher speed. Check your spreader on 250 square feet and adjust to apply at the rate of 1 pound per 250 square feet.
