Your Amendment Dated September 24, 1986

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under section 3(c)(7)(A) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), is acceptable provided that you:

1. Submit/cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment:
 - a. Refer to eggs as Food Grade prior to Directions for Use heading. Also in first sentence "... to sanitize and wash eggs ..." rather than clean eggs.
 - b. Change the ounces of CDB Clearon Wash Sanitizer so you will only have 100 ppm available chlorine maximum for sanitizing solution as stated in 21 CFR 178.1010 for triazinetriones.
 - c. Add to the label an instruction that the purchaser must be able to check chlorine level with an appropriate Chlorine Test Kit. Cannot fall below 50 ppm and not above 100 ppm. Add under Directions for Use heading; see enclosed sample label.

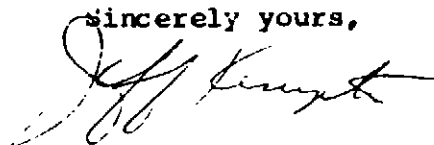

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:

It is a violation of federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with the label. For egg wash: Dissolve Wash Sanitizer in ten gallons of water. This provides 100 ppm of available chlorine solution and eggs may be rinsed with. For dishes, glasses, food utensils: dissolve one ounce of Sanitizer per ten gallons of water. This provides 100 ppm of available chlorine. Items prior to sanitizing. Treated in solution, hold for 15 minutes, allow to drip dry. Use in the feed tank for chickens providing two to five times sanitizing dishes, glasses, food utensils. The recommended sanitizing solutions should be mixed. If the solution is not mixed, additional CDB Clearon should be added to maintain a minimum of 100 ppm available chlorine.
