DIRECTIONS

ORTHO Tomato Vegetable Dust may be used as a dust or spray. For best results, dust or spray in early morning or late evening when temperature is low and air is still. Apply to all exposed parts of plants and vegetables, especially upper and lower leaf surfaces.

As a Spray: Mix 3 to 4 Tablespoons of product in 1 gallon of water, add 1 gallon water and spray during application. Make new solution for each use.

For Insect Control: Apply when insects first appear and repeat at 5 to 10 day intervals as necessary.

For Disease Control: Start program of dusting as soon as disease appears. Repeat at 1 to 2 week intervals for best protection. Can be used on Beans up to within 7 days of harvest, on Pumpkins within 14 days of harvest, on Potatoes within 1 day of harvest and on other listed leafy crops up to within 7 days of harvest. Remove residues from leafy crops by washing before use.
